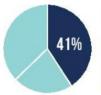

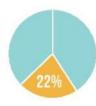

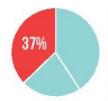

Beloved Trinity family,

We are "speed reading" the Bible in Confirmation class during our Winter and Spring quarters. So far, we've made it through the Pentateuch (Genesis to Deuteronomy), past the historical books (1 Samuel to 2 Chronicles), and all the way to Nehemiah. Sometimes we forget how much the early writings can teach us about our faith.

For instance, the life of Elijah. He is considered the greatest prophet in the Old Testament, but he did not have an easy life. Previous to the passage shown above, Elijah was forced to battle the prophets of Baal, end a drought, and flee for his life after King Ahab's evil wife Jezebel put out a contract on his life. Elijah is told the Lord "is about to pass by." And ... well ... you read the passage! God does not always show up as we expect!

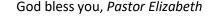
"What are you doing here, Elijah?" A good question for us as well.

But we are also making long-planned improvements to our church building, beginning with restoration of our historic stained-glass windows.

In April, I will celebrate my fifth anniversary as your lead pastor. It is a blessing and a privilege to serve Trinity.

Not too long ago I read an article about the epidemic of loneliness. The reaction to Covid was to shut everything down as much as possible. People were to social distance, no visits allowed in nursing homes, wear masks, stay home and other things. All were meant to keep us safe. But it did come with a cost. We are social creatures, but we were unable to be social. Many of us found different ways to communicate. We used zoom and skype calls, meetings and worship services. But it is not the same as a human face. The people who were most adversely affected were the elderly and homebound.

We have relaxed a lot of the restrictions the last few years. But Covid is still with us. And it is a concern.

My job that I try to do to the best of my abilities: sharing the love of God, continuing in the work of the saints of God who went before me. It is my joy to visit members of Trinity who are no longer able to physically be in church on Sunday. We visit and have devotions and Holy Communion. I also visit those in the hospital, though this has become more and more difficult due to the pandemic and not always knowing. I lead most of the services at the Manor, Tweeten Apartments, and Assisted Living. I share with Pastor Elizabeth the Nursing Home services. I always try to proclaim the Good News when I preach at Trinity.

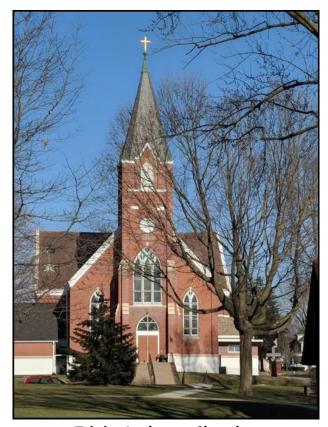

CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILY MINISTRY

We had a wonderful year of learning, faithful fun events, and growing in Jesus!

Early in 2022 we decided to move the 3rd -6th grade Sunday School to Wednesday nights after school! That program grew from 7 kids to now more than 35 youth. Praise God!

Pre-k through 2nd grade still meets on Sunday mornings in two different groups.

Our Confirmation program is thriving under the TrinityU format. The youth love the different ways they can interact in their faith life with different activities. Youth say they love their mentor groups time as they feel connected and loved while learning more about their faith in Jesus!

In November, we took 25 youth and adults to a retreat at Expeditions Unlimited in Baraboo Wi, where we focused on relationship building between our youth and our relationship with God. We spent time on a high ropes course, playing paintball, and worshiping around a campfire.

We have 122 youth in our Release Time Ministry that happens on Wednesday afternoons. Pr. Len Liptak and Kerri Jahnke lead this time of faith-filled activities, songs, and Bible stories. Starting in the fall, we started meeting at the Giants of the Earth Heritage Center due to the closing of the Trinity Center.

The High School Youth Group meets the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month from 6:30 p.m.-8:30 p.m. in the Youth Gathering Room for time in community, faith conversation, FAITH 5, and fellowship time of games and/or activities.

Over the Summer we had wonderful Wednesday Youth Bonfires where we spent time in devotions, playing games together and enjoying some s'mores. Gathering in faith community is important to a lot of our youth!

We brought our 7th grade youth to Confirmation Camp at Good Earth Village in July. They had a wonderful time experiencing outdoor ministry and felt closer to God in all the activities and worships they experienced!

We have had such a wonderful year growing and learning to be a light for Jesus!

God has blessed this church with many wonderful opportunities to provide faith formation for our youth and adults here at Trinity! We have so much to celebrate!

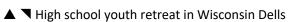

TRINITY TEAMS TOGETHER IN MISSION

STATEMENT OF IDENTITY

As people created by God, we live in gratitude for God's many gifts, and rejoice that:

- God forms us into a community in which we worship, pray, hear God's Word, share in the sacraments, confess our sin, receive forgiveness, and live in the unbounded grace of God;
- God calls us to be disciples of Jesus Christ, to grow in faith over our lifetime, and to share the good news of Jesus with all people;
- God equips us through the Holy Spirit to be the hands and feet of Christ in the world.

OUR VISION

By the grace of God in Christ, we live in peace and joy, connected to God and to one another, to further God's work on earth.

OUR MISSION

As a Christian community we spread the Good News, grow in faith, discover and use our gifts to serve God and to care for all people.

WE DO ALL OF THIS THROUGH OUR CONGREGATION TEAMS AND COMMITTEES

Executive Committee

The Executive Committee consists of the current president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer, and may meet between the regular meetings of the council if there are agenda concerns to address or planning to be done. The pastor(s) are *ex officio* members of the executive committee.

Team Leaders and Team Members

The ministries of Trinity Lutheran Church shall be carried out through ten teams: Care, Communication, Education, Finance, Mission in the World, Outreach, Property, Staffing, Stewardship, and Worship. Team members are elected by the congregation for two-year terms, and may succeed themselves two times. The mission, vision and goals of each team evolve to meet the needs of this congregation and community. These guidelines, approved by Congregation Council, are specific yearly goals that can be found in the team guidelines within the policy and procedures manual.

- **Care Ministry** Listen, respond, care, serve and pray for others.
- **Communications** Develops and implements a communication plan that supports the vision, mission, and goals of the congregation.
- **Education -** Develop life-long faith formation and Christian discipleship so that people are equipped and supported to share the Good News in Word and Deed.
- Finance Produce an annual budget, monitor income and expenses that support the congregation's goals and objectives. The treasurer of the Congregation Council is a non-voting member and attends Finance Team meetings and submits monthly financial reports to Council for review and approval.
- Mission in the World Spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ by supporting local, national, and international ministries.
- Outreach Develop faith-forming relationships within our homes, congregation and communities.
- Property Oversee the care, management, and maintenance of all properties of the congregation subject to Congregation Council approval; serve in a liaison and oversight relationship with the custodial staff; review maintenance contracts (snow, lawn, etc.); recommend needs regarding purchases of equipment, supplies, and maintenance services; review insurance coverage for all properties; inspect all properties on a regular basis to assess the safety, efficiency, appearance, and good order of all church property. The Trinity Cemetery Association will be totally responsible for the administration and maintenance of the active West Side Cemetery.
- Staffing Maintain supportive relationships with the pastor(s) and lay staff. Develop and review job descriptions, perform annual appraisals and coordinate with the Council salary increases. Be a part of the interviewing and hiring of new employees following the guidelines of the Hiring Committee Policy and conduct exit interviews with staff. Monitor areas of concern within the congregation related to pastoral care or ministry.
- Stewardship Develop and implement a plan to encourage and demonstrate the faith formation of being stewards of God's benevolence. Implements and oversees the Gift & Memorial Policy, encouraging gift giving to Trinity Church.
- Worship Praise God through vibrant cross-generational worship in our homes, congregation and community, thereby shaping daily life in the grace, mercy, and peace of God in Christ by: 1) Enhancing indoor and outdoor spaces to make them vibrant and welcoming. 2) Deepening worship experiences through music. 3) Planning and designing worship opportunities for the year.

CARE MINISTRY TEAM

2022was a busy year! We were so happy to share Prayer Shawls again. We continue shopping and stocking the Little Free Pantry. Thank you to those that drop off donations and those that give money to fund the Pantry and HIP (Health Initiative Program) at school.

Our team lines up 498-AMEN readers and schedules Meals on Wheels drivers. We collect Bag-a-Buck offering in the fall for Houston County Food Shelf. In the next couple months we will brainstorm ways to help those affected by the fire before Christmas.

On the second Saturday of December each year, we pack and deliver Christmas Cheer Bags. We were happy to have more recipients including many that recently moved to Spring Grove. Their surprise and gratitude "made our day!" A sweet lady that had received this gift in years past said she wanted her bag to go to someone else. She stated that it was because of the support and love from Trinity Church's members and staff and the kind people in Spring Grove, that she is feeling new success. She recently got a job working with children and her mentor there (a Trinity member), helps her immensely. She told me she's never been happier.

Christmas Cheer Bags contained: hams, scalloped potatoes, crackers and blocks of cheese, cereal, apples and oranges, pancake mix, Zaffke's syrup, and candy for the children. Our additional gifts were gift cards for Red's groceries and the Cinema. We delivered 42 bags and spent \$3,500. It was a beautiful day.

Early in 2022, we had 55 youth in Confirmation from Mabel, Wilmington, and Trinity.

In the fall of 2022, we had 45 youth (11 youth from Mabel, 2 from Wilmington, and 32 from Trinity).

We have 122 youth in our Release Time Ministry (photo) that happens on Wednesday afternoons. Pastor Len Liptak and Kerri Jahnke lead this time of faith-filled activities, songs, and Bible stories. Starting in the fall, we began meeting at the Giants of the Earth Heritage Center due to the closing of the Trinity Center.

We confirmed 19 youth on October 30th.

We served 570 meals from the Meatball Dinner youth fundraiser in May. We raised \$8,000 for the youth ministry trip account.

We sold maple syrup at the community farmer's market as a fundraiser.

WELCA supported our 7th grade youth to Confirmation Camp at Good Earth Village in July. Thank you to the WELCA group for your support.

National Youth Gathering was cancelled due Covid -19 and has been rescheduled for 2024.

Its been a great year of ministry and we are looking forward to 2023.

This year, we again coordinated the Thankful Gifts catalog which was available during the Advent season.

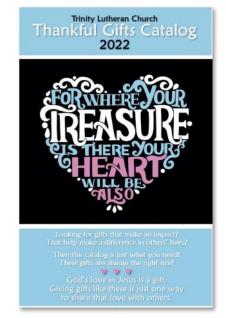
The "Noisy Offering" of \$261.40 was designated to Lutheran World Relief.

- · The Gathering Room was updated for youth and is now the Youth Gathering Room.

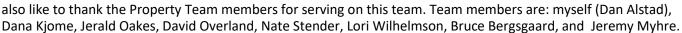
Parsonage:

With church services becoming open after the COVID shutdown, the work of the Worship Team has again moved back into full action. We have been busy organizing communion servers, lector readers, ushers, and special music. We helped plan outdoor services and decorated for Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas seasons.

We continue to organize the tuning, maintenance, and upgrades for our organ, pianos and other musical instruments. We organized purchases and upgrades for the equipment to make the Facebook and radio broadcasts more reliable. Our team member, Rick, continues to set up and run these broadcasts and we would like to thank Loren Esse for his continued special music.

I would like to thank Karen Bingham, Jackie Parker, Mark Schroeder, Rachel Storlie, and Rick Sundet for making this team fun to be a part of and for their willingness to complete all the tasks that make worship special.

MASTER PLANNING/FACILITY PLANNING COMMITTEE

On May 26, 2022, the Master Planning Committee (MPC) took a vote 11-1 in favor of continuing to pursue actions towards an addition to Trinity Church in order to carry out activities to serve our mission. After a significant down time due to COVID, the committee also voted 3 to stay with Cashman and 9 to look at another architect for a new overall view design since receiving additional information from assessing needs of Trinity church as a whole.

The MPC wrote and accepted a job description for a Project Manager, advertised in the bulletin, however received no applications.

The MPC set three top priorities along with pursuing a new architect for the addition.

- Stained glass windows assessment and repair
- Steeple repair of missing pieces of slate shingles
- Repair/ replacement of Fellowship Hall floor
- 1) After receiving 4 bids to restore stained glass windows, the council passed the recommendation of the MPC to hire Staige out of Onalaska to restore the 3 large windows on the south side of Trinity. Funds have been donated and the windows will be removed after January 1, 2023, and reinstalled before Easter. The congregation will have the opportunity to visit the "repair shop" and see the process of the window restoration in progress.
- 2) Steeple repair was referred to the Property Team for follow through.
- 3) The repair/replacement of the Fellowship Hall flooring is in consideration of logistics.

In regards to the addition, the MPC received a list of 29 architects from the SEMN synod office. Nolie Kapplinger, Bev Nelson, and Jacque Wennes reviewed each website and sent an email (see attached) to 8 firms. Four architectural firms responded. In January of 2023, a subcommittee of the MPC will interview these firms and bring their findings to the full MPC committee.

As of December 31, 2022, the building fund balance was \$475,881.85.

- 8) Are you able to design for phased building as different areas of our church need improvement?
- 9) What services will you provide for our church congregation during the design, bidding and construction phases?

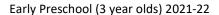
BEARY PATCH PRESCHOOL

The Beary Patch Board of Directors has recently made the hard decision to not renew our childcare license for 2023 and to discontinue our preschool program. The Spring Grove Public School system now offers a 4K program in its stead.

The Beary Patch has been a long-standing preschool program in Spring Grove and we are proud of all we have provided to our community through the years. The Beary Patch Preschool was founded in the mid-80's and was housed in the Trinity Center. Before that, children were able to attend preschool in the Trinity Church basement. The Beary Patch has always believed that every child has a right to a quality preschool education, regardless of their ability to pay. In the last five years alone, 60 children have attended the Beary Patch, and 19 have attended free of charge through the use of scholarships. In that time, we have provided thousands of free lunches for children in Spring Grove.

Although the Beary Patch Preschool will not be providing preschool for the children of our community, the Board of Directors are looking at ways to continue to support preschool-aged children in Spring Grove. The Beary Patch plans on offering scholarships to children of lower-income families to attend the Spring Grove School 4K program. We also plan to give a donation to the community in the form of playground equipment. MISSION ENDOWMENT FUND

The purpose of this fund is to help establish new ministries and seek additional stewardship opportunities that could be a part from the general operation of the congregation.

The fund was started in 1985 with a generous bequest of \$45,000. Since that time, it has grown to \$304,735. During that time we have granted over \$150,000 to college campus ministries, scholarships to people in the seminary, food shelves, local social services, and even our own Trinity Care Team! Please read our financial report to see where our support went in 2022.

The bulk of our investments, or 73%, is invested in Mission In-Faith funds. This is an ELCA-based firm located in Chicago that uses the funds to borrow at below-market interest rates to other "start-up" Lutheran churches that need financing for their building needs. The balance of 27%, is invested in a Thrivent-owned foundation called In-Faith funds. The purpose of the money invested there is to further grow our fund assets for future stewardship opportunities.

We invite all members of the congregation to consider a gift to this mission. It is an important part of our mission as Christians to support other Christians around the world. Our committee thanks you for your prayers and support in Trinity's Biblical mission.

SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT FUND

The Trinity Scholarship Endowment issued seven scholarships to freshmen students at a rate of \$500 each for a total of \$3,500. It also issued 11 scholarships to upperclassmen at a rate of \$1,250 each for a total of \$13,750. This was in keeping to disperse no more than 5% of the endowment funds as of January 1st statements from the past three years. Trinity women (WELCA) continue to fulfill their purpose "to commit ourselves to grow in faith, affirm our gifts, support one another in our callings, engage in ministry and action, and promote healing and wholeness in the church, our society and the world."

The ladies of WELCA have been happy to return to their activities and meeting in person. We have been once again able to provide for grieving families by serving a luncheon after the funeral service for their loved one. Love Day, the last Friday of each month, is a joy for us to gather to make quilts for LWR (Lutheran World Relief) and provide a few quilts to local people in need. Some of the gals also assemble Baby Care Kits and School Bags for LWR. For 2022 Trinity ladies sent 155 quilts, 220 Baby Care Kits, 256 School Bags, and 4 Personal Care Kits. With the assistance of the Mission in the World Team, these items were delivered to either the South St. Paul warehouse or the pickup center in La Crosse.

WELCA's Boutique has been set up once again, filled with hand-crafted items for sale. It is located in the Fellowship Hall.

WELCA coordinated once again a drive-through Fall Meatball Dinner, serving 769 dinners in 2 hours! The profits for the meal were distributed and are listed in WELCA's financial report. This remarkable event involves around 70 Trinity members helping in a variety of activities to prepare and serve the dinner.

We continue to offer prayers for the ability to be the hands to do God's Will.

CEMETERY ASSOCIATION

The West Trinity Cemetery is in good shape with recent additions of a water pipe system, two new hydrants and four trees along the west side. This year, eighteen headstones were cleaned, including several of the old veteran monuments that were covered with mold, moss and mildew. Two large stumps were removed so monuments could be placed on grave spaces and the blacktopped cemetery road received a seal coating. Next year the dead tree in the southeast section of the cemetery will be removed as it could damage some monuments and additional stumps will be removed when adequate funds are available.

Total Lawn Service of Spring Grove will again be taking care of the mowing. This is the third year of their contract for \$9,720 dollars divided into six equal payments for the summer. A new contract will be negotiated for the future starting with the summer of 2024. We are fortunate to have a lawn company that takes care of the cemetery grounds in a timely and tidy manner.

Eight cemetery lots were sold in 2022. There were 20 burials and of those 18 were cremation burials. The association members will review the current prices charged for gravesites at their next meeting.

Memorials received during 2022 were \$975.00 which was down due to Covid restrictions at funerals. Our Association investments were also down with market changes. Rent received for the cropland adjoining the cemetery was up from 2021.

The Buds and Blossoms Garden Club planted and cared for the two flower beds. The north flower bed was especially colorful this year. A thank you to all of the people who either placed flowers in urns or had Blooming Business of Spring Grove place and care for the colorful displays by so many gravesites.

We acknowledge Jim Wilhelmson's efforts in his role of cemetery care, historic record keeping, and sale of burial plots. During the year he tills the flower beds for plantings, marks gravesites for burials and monument placements, and fills in holes and low spots after burials; this task requires additional attention after winter burials.

We also thank Sue Wiste for her bookkeeping and payment of the Association bills and Brad Tostenson for his grave opening and closing services.

At our 2022 Synod Assembly, we gathered under the theme *Imagine: Endless Possibilities in God's Grace*. As we live into the future God has for us, we see what we had once only imagined start to take shape in concrete ways.

This year has brought a new way of meeting the needs of congregations in transition as we have explored various models for pastoral ministry. Most prominent among them is what we call a Bridge to Settled model. This new model allows congregations to work with a Bridge pastor (different than an intentionally trained interim) while forming a call committee and engaging in the call process with the understanding that both the pastor and congregation are open to transitioning from the Bridge into a settled call. It is not the right model for every congregation, but it has greatly benefited many.

We have also seen a gentle uptick in individual congregations exploring partnerships of all kinds. Some congregations are forming new joint parishes, others are working together to meld two part-time calls into full-time work for a single candidate, and still others are merging weekly confirmation classes. More and more of our congregations are realizing the profound benefits and joy of collaboration.

It has been fun to walk alongside folks as they lead their congregations into new ways of being the People of God in their community in this time and place.

As 2023 approaches, I remain ever hopeful for all that the Spirit will continue to do in and through us as the Southeastern Minnesota Synod. Looking ahead to our next Synod Assembly, I am excited to announce that we will be joined by Drs. Susan Brower and Matt Bloom. Drs. Brower and Bloom will give us tools to understand our communities as they are presently and as they are projected to be. They will also explore ways congregations can ignite flourishing in the communities to which they are called.

I am excited to continue imagining alongside each of you as we discern what God is doing in our midst and calling us to do. What a wonderful time to be the church together for the sake of the world.

2022 Annual Report to Congregations

Good Earth Village gratefully acknowledges the many faithful investments from our congregational partners. From your financial contributions, to volunteer hours, to providing program leadership, to hosting our staff, to your prayers and other service, **you all make the Village**.

Congregational financial support provided in monthly, annual, and special gifts/grants.

- 76 congregations made an unrestricted financial, missional investment in this outdoor ministry, totalling \$88,047
- 2 congregations contributed \$14,300 combined in grants and event sponsorships
- 47 WELCA partners made combined contributions of \$11,870, and several more made in-kind donations
- 21 congregations and ministry partners held retreats at Good Earth Village

Over half of annual financial needs are met by individuals, congregations, WELCA groups, conferences, and businesses. 2021 Annual Meeting • January 30, 2022 • in-person and via Zoom • 10:45 a.m.

President Saundy Solum called the meeting to order at 10:48 a.m.

Per Trinity Lutheran Church's Constitution, 50 people in attendance is needed for a quorum. 42 people attended in person, and 21 attended via Zoom. Howard Deters was in attendance and served as the parliamentarian. Pastor Elizabeth Hermeier opened the meeting with prayer and lead litany that was spoken.

Saundy advised of the following changes to the 2020 Annual Meeting Minutes: the first sentence has a typo, meeting was held "via" zoom. The second paragraph should read that "Saundy Solum called the meeting to order." Paragraph seven should read that all changes to the Constitution passed. Saundy asked for a motion to approve the 2020 minutes with the changes shared. Motion made by Mark Schroeder, seconded by Bev Nelson. Motion passed.

Barb Arnold shared the financial reports as follows: Our total income for 2021 was \$388,455, which included \$10,070 of the government money. Total expenses for 2021 were \$376,283. Our profit and loss statement show a profit of \$12,172 with all the bills paid, including the \$14,000 we borrowed from ourselves. Thank you! At the January Council meeting, it was voted to send some of this profit to help others: \$2,000 was sent to ELCA Disaster Response (\$1,000 to the Kentucky tornados damage and \$1,000 to the Colorado fires damage), and \$500 to Special Accounts to purchase Kwik Trip gas cards. Special Accounts has almost \$93,000 in donations. Many of the teams use this money to support their programs. Over \$36,000 was used in 2021. Good Samaritan Fund gave out over \$7,000 to our community members in need. Care and Outreach Teams are highlighted on page 16 and 19 of the Annual Report. These team members work hard in planning, shopping, packaging, and delivering food and gifts to those in need. Thank you for your contributions! Willing hands are an extremely necessary and valuable part of Trinity's ministry. In the Special Accounts expenses, you will see \$23,000 for parsonage improvements. This money comes form the pastor's Ministries Support Fund that was donated when Trinity was calling a pastor. Pr. Elizabeth can use this money however she wishes. She has been very generous using some of the money towards improvements at the parsonage property each year. We can all appreciate her generosity. Our mission work is another important part of Trinity's ministry. On page 30 of the Annual Report, there is a listing of mission activities supported, both locally and globally that add up to \$74,404. All these deeds are done out of the goodness of your hearts. We are a community where we can rely on one another and build each other up with care, love and prayer. These are some of our greatest gifts. Some of you contribute so much. Our WELCA ladies are just one example of that, engaging in several ways with their activities. Hopefully, this coming year many more members will become involved with the numerous experiences available for you. God Bless all of us! Saundy asked for a motion to accept the Financial Reports. Justin Landsom made motion, seconded by Terry Holland. Motion passed.

Pr. Elizabeth shared that she will be at Trinity four years on April 1st. She feels so blessed by her call to this congregation and community. She is so overjoyed with what has been done these past two years during the pandemic. She has seen what God has done for us and how God works through us. It feels so good to be able to say "yes" because of all of you saying "yes". We get to say "yes" because of God's great blessings. She is looking forward to saying "yes" in 2022!

Al Frydenlund presented the budget for 2022: \$302,710 for the year, which comes out to \$5,473 per week. This is a slight increase from last year. The budget is up for 2022 as general expenses have increased. There is 3% wage increase for staff. Teams that use Special Accounts are the following: Education, Mission in the World, Worship (Media Ministry), Care Ministry, and Outreach. Al Frydenlund made a motion to pass the budget as presented, seconded by Steve Nelson. Mary Deters questioned what percentage of the budget goes to the SE MN Synod. Barb Arnold shared that it varies throughout the year: 4% to \$100,000, 5% to \$250,000, 6% to \$300,000, and 7% over 300,000. No further discussion. Motion passed.

Milly Halverson presented the 2022 Ballot and elections. She advised of two additional changes to the ballot: Terry Holland will serve as the Outreach Team Lead, and Elaine Kjome will take Terry's place on the Outreach Team. Milly advised that we may need one more on the Education Team, and one more on the Stewardship Team. Milly asked for nominations/volunteers for the Nominating Committee. Lara Wold Mendez, Gary Wilhelmson, and Barb Arnold volunteered. Milly asked for representatives from Trinity Lutheran to attend the SEMN Synod Assembly on Saturday, May 7 in Mankato (one day), Saundy Solum, Jacque Wennes, and Mark Schroeder volunteered. Milly made a motion to accept the 2022 team ballot with the additions, seconded by Jackie Parker. Motion passed.

Pr. Elizabeth and Saundy advised to look for more information on a facility plan and information from the Master Plan Committee. Pastor Elizabeth Hermeier shared a Closing Prayer and Benediction.

Milly Halverson made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Gary Wilhelmson. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 11:15 a.m.
