TRINITY LUTHERAN CONGREGATION COUNCIL

February 9, 2022

OPENING BUSINESS:

The Trinity Lutheran Congregation Council meeting was called to order by Saundy Solum at 7:03 p.m. on February 9, 2022.

Pr. Elizabeth opened the meeting with a prayer.

Secretary's Report for January 12, 2022 was read. Steve Nelson asked to verify that the \$7,000 voted on last month to help pay for the boiler in the Trinity Center was in tuck pointing portion of the Special Accounts. Pr. Elizabeth confirmed. Steve K. made a motion to accept the secretary's report, seconded by Terry. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report (placed on file) Highlights listed below.

- Special Accounts have a balance of \$184,000.
- General Fund's checking balance end of January is \$30,049.

STAFF REPORTS:

Pastor Elizabeth:

- Confirmation winter quarter begins next week, continuing with our study of Luther's Catechism. Electives also begin in February. I'm teaching elective classes on Esther, Art Appreciation, and Women of the Bible. Remember: Trinity U classes are open to ALL members, not just Confirmation students!
- 2. I was extremely pleased with how the Annual Meeting went. Conducting it both in person and via Zoom is challenging, but I thought it worked very well. I'd love to see more "young" people attending, and I'd love to brainstorm ideas about how to get them involved.
- 3. During December and January, I had six funerals. We have three baptisms (one last Saturday) and two weddings tentatively scheduled for the year.
- 4. I'm very grateful to those who volunteered to serve on the Master Plan Committee, and I look forward to the results of this process. Luann Ferguson of the Mission Investment Fund of the ELCA and I had a great conversation last week. She reiterated that we are on the right path, volunteered to come down here if we think it would be helpful, and forwarded some additional

resources and information for the team. For the record, I want to reiterate that I believe the building addition will enhance the ministries of the congregation. I realize we have many other facility needs, and the good news is that we have some funds to make at least some of them happen. One thing I can tell you is that young parents are VERY interested in seeing the building project happen. As I've had conversations with some of them, I've encouraged them to get involved and make their ideas known.

- 5. I took a "Lent in a Box" class on January 24 from Church Anew, an organization that offers many classes and resources for churches and church leaders. Our Lenten theme this year is Psalm 23. My plan is to have two services on Ash Wednesday (March 2), one at noon and the other at 7. Our Lenten services will be approximately 30 minutes long on subsequent Wednesdays, with Holden Evening Prayer as the liturgy.
- 6. I also just completed a Luther Seminary online course on Theology and Ethics of Digital Ministry. (As I write this, I've only completed the first half – the second half will be next Tuesday, February 8.) An opinion article recently appeared in the NY Times entitled "Why Churches Should Drop Their Online Services." The gist of the article is that worship is an "embodied" community experience and that offering a hybrid experience makes "embodiment elective." I, too, have had conversations with members wondering if we should "shut off Facebook" at some point. And my answer is "no." We wouldn't shut off the radio ministry, would we? There have always been and always will be members who are reasonably cautious about gathering in large groups. We need to offer them the most robust worship experience possible. In addition, and I'm going to be rather blunt here, we will never, in essence, blackmail people into "coming back" to church in person by threatening to shut off their online resource. We have also extended our reach tremendously with our online presence, offering a broader experience to regular attendees and a new experience to people, including non-members, at great distances. Finally, as one pastor wrote, this is a new world. We need to reach people where they are. Or as another said, "the world has changed – get over it!" Jesus was a disrupter. Martin Luther was a disrupter. God did not cause the pandemic, but God certainly has been working with us through it to expand our reach. We need to have faith and trust that God will continue to work with us and through us as we come out of the pandemic into a new and always changing world.
- 7. Looking forward:
 - a. The Root River Conference Assembly (online via Zoom) is Sunday, February 20, 2-4 PM. Trinity members attending are Congregation President Saundy Solum, Jacque Wennes, Mark Schroeder, and me. The Synod Assembly is Saturday, May 7, in Mankato. Proof of vaccination or negative COVID test is required to attend in person.
 - b. Ash Wednesday is March 2 (see above).
 - c. We will be hosting the pastors of the Root River Conference for our monthly meeting here on Tuesday, March 8 from 9-noon. As we get closer to that date, I may ask for help with light refreshments (depending on the COVID situation).
- 8. To be continued: What is God calling us to do in 2022? How are we called to see Jesus and be Jesus for this community in this time? How can we share our abundance to serve God's mission and God's church? How are we called to be a blessing?
