 Center by September 1 as long as we have a place for release time, seconded by
 John, motion carried.

b. Boiler

 We will not be updating the boiler. Dan will check with Dave Eiken on the status of the parts ordered.

8. Chamber update

- Chamber can do things for us such as advertising.
- Pr. Elizabeth asked for council's advice on where to place the Spring Grove Chamber Member window cling. Council advised on the south door to the offices.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Director of Children, Youth & Family Ministry full time
 - John made a motion to hire Kerri full time, Bethany seconded. John stated that Kerri's salary would be around \$8,000 more for the year. Motion carried.

2. Windows

- Pr. Elizabeth met with an anonymous donor who asked for needs for the church. She
 mentioned the windows project. The donor offered that they will match up to 30k of
 what we can raise.
- We have had a couple of quoted in the past in 2013, \$149.7K for all windows, and in 2017, \$193K for all windows.
- Associated Glass Willet Hauser out of Winona coming tomorrow to give a quote on the windows on the south and west side. We would not be doing the northside as this would be apart of the addition/building project.
- Pr. Elizabeth will bring to the congregation on Sunday and get the fundraising started.

3. Parsonage Porch

• Porch is deteriorating. Gary got a bid from the lumber company: \$3,350.00 for the porch. An additional \$870 for underneath framework. \$395 for the facia. Total if all this needed to be done, \$4,615.00. \$2,000 in the budget. Dan made a motion to get the remaining funds from sale of the second parsonage, seconded by John. Motion carried.

• Terry made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Dan seconded. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 9:15pm.
