June 9, 2021

STAFF REPORTS:

Pastor Elizabeth:

- 1. The lessening of restrictions for worship and other activities has gone very well, I think. We're now resuming (almost) regular communion as well.
- 2. Baccalaureate went very well! We had terrific weather for the outdoor service which was also on FB Live. Approximately 2/3 of graduates and their families attended.
- 3. The Diversity Team has been continuing to meet, and the conversations have been excellent! We are collecting, reading, and watching various resources. Nolie Kapplinger has taken the lead, and the SEMN Synod is now beginning to gather information about congregations that are having diversity conversations. Nolie graciously volunteered to represent us with the Synod for future joint efforts.
- 4. The plan for a possible addition to the church building is VERY close and I believe it answers all the needs identified by the congregation very well–we'll discuss tonight.
- 5. The meatball dinner at Syttende Mai was a tremendous success. We may increase the number of meals next year –we ran out in an hour!
- 6. The virtual Festival of Homiletics May 18-21was enlightening, as always. I really enjoy attending these conferences, even online. Bekah and I are now taking a Faith + Lead class called

"Burnout and Bias" that meets 1-1/2 hours a week for 4 weeks. The first session was very good, and I think there will be some good information to share with our Diversity group and for the congregation.

- 7. Wednesday Vacation Bible School begins tonight! I'm excited about our 7 p.m. Vesper services for June. Then confirmation camp is next week. Exhausting but wonderful!
- 8. We have (had) 6 baptisms coming up in June and July –what a blessing!
- 9. I am very excited about our plans for a "revival" weekend September 18-19. There is no doubt in my mind that the Holy Spirit has been present and active in our faith community for the past 15 months. But many people are understandably still cautious about group events, others have gotten into the habit of watching or listening to worship, and some have gotten discouraged about God's action in the world considering COVID, system racism, economic inequality, and political and social differences. As we come out of this pandemic, we have a great opportunity to gather and celebrate who –and Whose –we are, and to reignite our faith in God and our mission for the world. We have reserved the Fest Building for our regular 5 p.m. communion worship service Saturday, followed by a big community concert at 7 p.m. The theme of the weekend is "Behold, I make all things new" from Revelation 21. We'll coordinate this weekend with Rally Sunday for our youth, and hopefully a potluck lunch to follow. We'll send out "Save the Date" information in a few weeks, advertise in the local papers (and on KVIK), the bulletin, the newsletter, etc. And then another postcard in early September as a reminder.

Mission (Dean)

- Mission Team met to discuss how to disburse money from the Missionary-for-a-daycandle and Noisy Offering.

Property (Dan)

- \$3,500 bid from Landsom Brothers to take down 8 ash trees and 4 pine trees at the parsonage.
- Still waiting on a bid from Ongrade Excavating for the cement work at the parsonage.

Staffing (Meets the 3rd Thursday each month) (Jan)

- There were 3 recent resignations: Bekah Leafblad, CYF Ministry, Lorilyn Dehning, Bookkeeper and Willy Leafblad, Bell Choir Director. The Bookkeeping position is being advertised and the CYF Ministry and Bell Choir Director positions will be advertised soon. Candidates for open positions will be interviewed after reviewing their qualifications and references.
- An exit interview is scheduled with Bekah Leafblad next Thursday, June 17th.
- A motion will be made at Council to renew Pr. Lane Zaffke's one-quarter time contact at the salary proposed in the 2021 budget. When his salary is renewed again, Staffing recommends a 2 year one-quarter time contract. This change from a one year to two-year contract was discussed with Pr. Lane.

Stewardship (Steve)

- Plan to send out the 6th month giving statements at the end of June.
- Talked about making envelopes for offering for the Sunday School and Confirmation students
- Servant Sunday is August 29.

Worship (Kim)

- Talked about the suggestions from the Music Task Force.
- Plan to meet in August to discuss the plan for the first few months of the fall. Will work with the music leaders.

CONTINUING BUSINESS:

- 1. Response team updates
 - Back to in person worship. Masks are encouraged for those who are uncomfortable and for those who have not be vaccinated.
 - Will not meet unless it is needed.
- 2. Facility Planning update
 - Saundy and Pr. Elizabeth present the preliminary blue prints for the church addition from the Visioning and Planning Team.
 - The Visioning and Planning Team will next look over the preliminary blue prints and talk with the contractor for a quoted price.
 - The Visioning and Planning Team will then bring this all to the congregation.
- 3. Diversity "Team"update
 - There are 8 people who have met 3 times and have talked about various diversity issues.
- 4. Music Task Force update
 - The Music Ministry Taskforce (MTF) was formed to review Trinity's music ministry; it's rich past, current offerings and possibilities for the future. The MTF completed their work in May and shared a report with the Council. The report included areas for consideration and a few recommendations that emerged after MTF discussions and review of surveys completed by music leaders and other involved in Music Ministry.
 - The Music Taskforce (MTF) proposed 4 areas for further consideration by the Pastor, Worship Team and others involved in Music Ministry. Areas included: 1) highlighting current Music Ministry, 2) integrating musical talent throughout the service, 3) enhancing contemporary worship service and, 4) increasing participation in Music Ministry.
 - The MTF made two recommendations for the Pastor, Finance, Staffing and Worship Teams. The recommendations included: 1) a review of Music Ministry budget including current staffing and projected needs and, 2) an evaluation of the planning and scheduling process for Music Ministry.
 - Challenges identified by MTF members and those surveyed included: a) recruitment of individuals for all aspect of Music Ministry, b) commitment required for participation in all aspects of Music Ministry and, c) competing obligations for all age groups and families who consider participation in Music Ministry.
 - The MTF also acknowledged the many contributions of those with musical gifts at Trinity and the considerable talents of our music leaders. The MTF concluded that music has been and will continue to be central to worship at Trinity.
 - Members of the MTF were J Kraabel (chair), B. Fried, K. Kapplinger, W. Leafblad, M. Schroeder, R. Storlie and J. Tollefsrud.
- 5. Team Guidelines & Procedures

- Saundy shared the "draft" copy. She is asking for all to read through all the teams' responsibilities and suggest any changes or items missing.
- Saundy is still waiting on Endowment.
- 6. VBS meals for Family Camp
 - a. June 9 Finance, Communication & Property
 - b. June 16 Care, Staffing & Stewardship
 - c. June 23 Education coordinating
 - d. June 30 Worship, Outreach & Mission
- 7. Insurance
 - Judy made a motion to increase insurance coverage to \$4.5 million. This comes to an extra \$1,500 a year premium for all properties Trinity Center, Parsonage, Church. The Worship Team will be asked to try to determine a value of the organ at which time another change to the policy may be necessary. Dan seconded. Passed.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Renewal of Pastor Lane's contract
 - A motion was made by Jan to renew Pr. Lane Zaffke's one-quarter time contract at the salary proposed in the 2021 budget. Dean seconded. Passed.
- 2. Personnel changes
 - Plans are to advertise the Children Youth & Family position in the next week.
- 3. Trees at the parsonage
 - Dan made a motion to have the Landsom Brothers remove the 12 trees at the parsonage. Jan seconded. Passed.
- 4. Endowments
 - Pr. Elizabeth received all 3 Endowment Reports. We have several special accounts. Saundy will plan to have as an agenda item in the near future to look at all the different special accounts.
- 5. All Team Retreat
 - Sunday, August 15, 2021. 10:30 am to 12:30 pm at the church.
- 6. Leafblad Family going away party
 - Sunday, August 1 as part of fellowship, right after church.
