### **BIBLE STUDY**

### Read Romans Chapter 9-12

In chapter 9 of Romans, Paul discusses "selection." Specifically, Paul tries to explain to "new" Christians how traditional Jews, God's chosen people, fit in the picture. What, he asks, really makes God's people God's people? "What does this all mean?" Paul asks in 9:30. In 10:4b, Paul writes "all who believe in him are made right with God." Continuing that theme, Paul writes: "If you openly declare that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." (10:9) He continues: "Jew and Gentile are the same in this respect. They have the same Lord, who gives generously to all who call on him. For 'Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." (10:11b-12)

In chapter 12, Paul asks the young churches to be a "living sacrifice to God." This passage is one of several in which Paul promotes the metaphor of the "body of Christ." We all have different gifts, all of which work together for the good of all. In 12:7-12,

Paul gets specific about some of these gifts: service, teaching, encouraging, leadership, etc.

Saundy asked council members to read Romans Chapter 13-16 for next month. Pr. Elizabeth asked all to find out what is the tricky phrase (verse) that is used.
