November 13, 2019

The Trinity Lutheran Congregation Council meeting was called to order by Steve Nelson at 7:45 pm on November 13, 2019 in the Gathering Room.

Members Present: Steve Nelson, Barb Arnold, Jacque Wennes, Steve Kemp, Willy Leafblad, Janna Myrah (for Karen Bingham), and Lara Wold Mendez. Absent: Mary Deters, Milly Halverson, Karen Bingham.

Pr Elizabeth opened the meeting with prayer.

Secretary's Report for October 9, 2019 was approved as corrected. (Pastor Elizabeth presented an oral report . Cross out "full report placed on file." Under continuing business, the section on Facilities Planning Team update, should read "A third architectural firm, CRW from Rochester, is scheduled for October 30.")

Treasurer's Report (placed on file)

- Income for the first 10 months is 4.3% lower than for the same period last year. Online income is up and offering received on Sundays is down.
- We owe ourselves \$14,000 and the bank \$25,000. Our budget-based offering is \$5100 per Sunday. We are averaging \$4512 weekly.

Pastor Elizabeth (full report placed on file)

- In the past month we have had three services with more than 200 in attendance.
- Bekah and Pr. Elizabeth participated in confirmation at Wilmington.
- Trinity U classes have been going well.
- There have been several losses in our community: Kari Schultz, David Severson, and Stan and Donna Guberud
- She participated in the Habitat for Humanity "Women Build" in October.
- She did a number of shut-in visits while Pastor Lane was on vacation.
- She has attended four meetings with potential design/build and architectural/build firms.
- Last week she attended the Southeast Minnesota Synod's Fall Theological retreat in New Ulm.
- She will attend the Farmer Roundtable at Giants tomorrow.
- She has been elected to serve on the Synod's nominating committee.
- Thirst Day attendance was down in September and October.
- We will be introducing a new evening prayer service for Advent called "Joyous Light."
- She affirmed the selection of our newly-elected bishop who intends to meet with every pastor and congregation and has already met with 43 of them.

Care Ministry

- The team is preparing for the Christmas Cheer food deliveries.

Education(Jacque)

- Rehearsals for the Christmas program have begun. The Christmas program will be during the December 15 service.
- Release Time classes are going well with the help of Calvary's leaders Kimberly and Jan. There are almost 100 children in attendance.
- Eight Trinity students affirmed their faith on October 14th.
- We currently have 8 youths and 6 adults signed up to go to Puerto Rico during the summer of 2020,
- A reminder that Trinity U classes are for adults also. Get a schedule from Bekah and enlighten your life!

Mission in the World (Steve N)

- Their next project is the Alternative Giving Fair, beginning on December 1 and running until December 22.

After conversation with all in attendance, the unanimous recommendation was that Trinity should sell the

Trinity Center property. The storage building on the north side of the property was not discussed. Those not in
attendance, Lorilyn and Nolie, were briefed on the meeting and expressed agreement with the
recommendation. Support was expressed for Beary Patch Preschool and Release Time as both being important
parts of Trinity's mission. Should Trinity Center be sold, alternative locations for these programs would need to
be secured.

MSC (Steve K., Barb) to recommend to the congregation that the Council put up for sale the Trinity Center building and its storage facility .

PTO Policy (PTO and Holiday Policy for Part-Time Hourly Employees placed on file)

MSC (Steve K., Lara) to accept the PTO policy and the addendum as presented in the written document.
