WHAT IS GOD CALLING US TO DO? Come to a Congregational Meeting on July 14.

Over the last month there have been some concerns raised about the Visioning and Planning recommendations as outlined in the June newsletter. The article led some people to believe that our existing church building might be torn down and a new one built. I'm so sorry about any distress you may have experienced as a result of that article.

As I mentioned during our announcements at worship on June 16, it is not the recommendation to tear down and build new. On the contrary, the overwhelming responses during the Visioning and Planning process were that people love our existing sanctuary. And as I said, I believe we'll be worshipping here for many years to come.

That said, there were a lot of concerns about how the existing space (fellowship, education, offices) is limiting us, and even preventing us from performing our ministries to their fullest.

I hope you all plan to attend this important congregational meeting on July 14 (after worship in the sanctuary) so we can discuss this in more detail, and so we can discern a way forward to make changes to our existing church building – and this MIGHT include a small addition to the existing church building – so that we can do what God is calling us to do without limits.

At the June meeting, the Congregation Council voted unanimously to select Leonard Myrah to be the Building Team Chairperson for a potential space enhancement. Anyone interested in serving on the Building Team, please leave your name with the church office.

We have just completed a major project with the installation of our new boiler/air-conditioning system, raising an extraordinary amount of funds in a short amount of time to execute the project. If we proceed with a project to enhance our existing building, we will do it thoughtfully and prayerfully, and we will not proceed without a sensible plan to finance the changes.

Please plan to attend the Congregational meeting and please keep Trinity in your prayers.

Youth Mission Trip to Indianapolis: July 27-August 3

The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit. John 3:8

Dear friends in Christ,

As I write this, I am on vacation in New Mexico, where the elevation is 7,000 feet above sea level. By comparison, the elevation in Spring Grove is 1,322 feet above sea level. If you've climbed or travelled in the mountains, you know you can really feel the difference – especially the first few days. You get a little breathless when you walk. You might get dizzy or light-headed, or even feel fatigued.

We're led to believe that the "air is thinner," that there's less oxygen at higher elevations, but it turns out air contains 20.9% oxygen at all altitudes. (Yes, I Googled it.) In reality, it's the lower air *pressure* at high altitude that makes it feel like there's less oxygen. Because of the lower air pressure there are fewer molecules of everything present, including oxygen. So it turns out it's the pressure that keeps us from breathing deeply, from absorbing oxygen, so we have the energy we're used to.

On the Day of Pentecost, the disciples absorbed the Holy Spirit like much-needed oxygen, and that gave them the energy to preach the gospel of Jesus, to start churches, and to use their gifts – the gifts of the Spirit – to respond to the needs of their neighbors.

What pressures, I wonder, prevent us from absorbing the Holy Spirit completely? Some are external – the responsibilities and stresses we experience in our lives – but some are internal. Sometimes, I think, our fears or anxieties prevent us from using our gifts to their fullest. We fear where the wind might blow us.

In our baptisms, we received the Holy Spirit as a gift. During this season of Pentecost, I hope we will look anew at where the Spirit of God might be leading us. We can trust that God will be with us every step of the way.



PUERTO RICO MISSION TRIP Trinity will be taking a mission trip to Puerto Rico in the summer of 2020! Youth <u>and</u> adults are welcome to be a part of this trip. The dates of the trip are July 25-August 1, 2020. Starting and ending dates are subject to change depending on when flights can be booked, but we will definitely be in Puerto Rico from July 26-31 of next year!

There will be an informational meeting on Sunday, July 7 at 10:30 (following worship) in the sanctuary. I don't have much information yet as the trip is still a year from now, but I will do my best to answer your questions! The meeting is not mandatory to reserve your spot, but encouraged if you have questions.

Optimistically, this trip will cost \$1,000 per person. This price ultimately depends on flights and if we can get a good deal on them. Please know that this \$1,000 is not set in stone yet and the price could end up ranging from \$1,000-\$1,300. There will be many fundraisers in the coming year to help raise money for the trip participants will likely not have to pay this full amount out of pocket. Also, scholarships are available for Trinity mission trips. Please do not let price be a deterrent in signing up for this trip - we will find a way!

Would you like to participate in this mission trip to Puerto Rico?! If you would, I will need to get your name on our list as soon as possible. I am expecting slots for this trip to fill quickly. If you would like to commit to this trip, I will need a \$50 non-refundable deposit by Monday, July 15 to hold your place as a participant on this mission trip. The \$50 will go toward the overall cost of the trip.

WOMEN OF THE ELCA'S MISSION AND PURPOSE Several women gathered in January to discuss how to best fulfill Women of the ELCA's mission and purpose in a changing world. An 11-woman exploratory committee met and centered its work on investigating the organization's current business model. The committee was created at the behest of the churchwide executive board's budget and finance committee at the board's April 2018 meeting. "On my flight home [from the meeting], I had some time to reflect over the course of the weekend and felt a full and grateful heart," said Lisa Plorin, churchwide president for the 2017–2020 triennium. "It was inspiring to be in the presence of women from all corners of the United States who have the same passion for this organization as I do." Plorin said she is looking forward to seeing how the committee's plans grow to ensure the life and vitality of the Women of the ELCA. Plorin supported the work of the committee in an ex officio capacity.

The committee began its work examining the organization's governance structure, communication methods, constitutional structure and financial realities. Following a small group brainstorming session, the Rev. Leila Ortiz, chaplain for the committee and an assistant to the bishop in the Metro D.C. Synod, led a Bible study based on 2 Kings 5. She reminded committee members that everyone is relevant to the issue. Ortiz asked, "Who is not at this table? Who could give the organization new life? Who has wisdom to share?" Like Naaman's experience in the biblical passage, the process of bringing about new life will likely be messy, Ortiz said, and may take several different approaches. Ortiz offered the committee members a repeated question over their weekend meeting: What must die so Women of the ELCA can come alive again?

The committee listed the many assets of Women of the ELCA: people, publications, giving to the annual budget, (Katie's Fund, restricted funds, synodical-held funds, congregational unit held funds, expectation of planned gifts and intellectual property). Over the next several months, the committee will engage participants in a variety of ways, asking questions and gathering data. Questions to consider: 1) If you could make changes to our constitutions to encourage more participation in the organization, what would they be?

2) Annual revenue from offerings has been insufficient to pay for the convention over the past two triennium. How could your SWO assist with the costs? 3) Why is this organization important to you? If this organization went away tomorrow, would you miss it? The committee broke into two sub-groups, one to examine constitutional issues and one to create assessment tools. Following this in-person meeting, the committee will continue its work by email and conference calls. The committee will offer a report at its October 2019 meeting.


JUNE 12, 2019 CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Motions approved:

- To accept the recommendation of the Staffing Team to hire Kayla Tollefsrud for the part-time (20-25 hrs/wk) Trinity Church custodian position at \$12/hour, for a probationary period of three months, after which time the position will be reassessed.
- To nominate Len Myrah as chair of the Building Team.
- To schedule a Congregational Meeting on July 14 following worship in the sanctuary, to discuss the opportunity to enhance our existing building based on the work done by the Visioning & Planning Team.
- To accept the recommendation of the Property Team to put aside monies that would have gone to the custodial salary, since David's retirement on April 21, into a maintenance and repair fund to be used to do needed work around the church.
- To accept the recommendation of the Property Team to immediately close the north ramp for safety reasons.

Next Meeting: July 10 at 7:00 p.m. in the Gathering Room.

Synod update

2019 SYNOD ASSEMBLY IN REVIEW The 2019 Southeastern Minnesota Synod Assembly took place at the Mayo Civic Center in Rochester on May 31-June 1. During the gathering, Rev. Regina Hassanally was elected as the synod's next bishop! We rejoice and give thanks!

Rev. Eric Barreto served as this year's Bible Study leader. Presiding Bishop Eaton was the churchwide representative and officiated over the balloting process. Current synod bishop, Rev. Steven Delzer, shared his final Report of the Bishop during assembly; his retirement begins on August 31. We rejoice in the Spirit's movement throughout the entire assembly, and we give thanks for all who were involved in the planning and preparation of this sacred gathering!

We also extend special thanks to all involved in the process of calling our next synod bishop - from assembly voters, to the Committee on the Election of Bishop, to the nominees! Thank you! An article can be found in the June 1 edition of the Rochester Post-Bulletin about the process and Rev. Hassanally's election.

The offering total from the two assembly worship services is over \$40,000 (the final number will be shared after all gifts have been received). Thank you for your generosity! This year's offering will support Good Earth Village, Luther Seminary, and our two campus ministries in Winona and Mankato! Trinity contributed \$1,000 to these important ministries.


