### A VERY SPECIAL LENT FOR TRINITY

There is always a lot going on this time of year for Christians. This is certainly the case for the Trinity church family. We are gathering every Wednesday of **Lent** for prayer, music, and reflection on the Psalms of David. March 25 will be our celebration of Palm Sunday. Then we are into **Holy Week** with special worship on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Added to all this is the **Special Congregational Meeting on March 4** where we hear about and vote on a candidate for pastor; something Trinity only does once every 10-15 years. Please join us for this special meeting.

A **Congregational Meeting** to elect a pastor is more than just a chance to hear about the candidate and cast a vote. It is an important time of sharing the joy of the Call Committee who found, amongst many candidates, one unique person to bring into the Trinity family. It is a time of discovering this unique person's gifts and looking ahead. What are the possibilities for this unique person with these unique gifts to serve in this unique place? Also, how do our gifts complement those of the candidate and strengthen the mission of Trinity? Join us for this wonderful moment in the life of Trinity. And give thanks to God who connects unique people with unique places to the glory of his Son.

Another special group to remember this Lent: our fifth graders! It's time for **First Communion**. We have 16 fifth graders this year. We will use our worship service on Maundy Thursday, the day of Jesus' Last Supper with the disciples, as a reverent service of First Communion. The kids will have things to memorize. They will learn about unleavened bread. They will learn where to stand, when to kneel, how to hold their hands. They will taste wine. The most important thing, however, is that they come to recognize the loving grace of Jesus Christ as they kneel at the altar and receive the bread and wine. Please join me in prayer for them as we move toward Maundy Thursday. Communion can be a deep experience of the living Christ, nurturing us in hard times and bringing us joy in happy times. Let us pray that our fifth graders will be aware of the presence of the Christ's Spirit as they take their first communion.

#### MINNESOTA FOOD SHARE - MARCH CAMPAIGN

Some people face food insecurity every day, while others struggle after an unexpected expense or decrease in income. Hunger can lead to poor health or illness in addition to poor performance at school or work. Semcac's Food Shelf in Caledonia had 2,152 visits from 340 households and distributed 103,227 pounds of food.

The annual Minnesota Food Share March campaign promotes the collection of food and funds to stock food shelves across the state. As an official participant, Semcac's Food Shelf will receive a percentage of the undesignated statewide March Food Share funds. The allocation depends on the amount of food and money raised during March and on the number of people served during the remainder of the year.

The Care Team of Trinity Lutheran Church encourages donations of food and money to help with this campaign. In the month of March, you will find an envelope in the bulletin to place a donation for the Food Shelf. Donations must be received by March 29 to count toward the March Food Share campaign.

Fill a bag for our local Food Shelf. Respond to food insecurity in our community by filling a grocery bag with much needed food and household items for our local Food Shelf. Trinity Sunday School will participate in the food drive also. Look for details coming home with your children

Trinity has a small food shelf that we will call a Tiny Pantry not to be confused with Semcac Food Shelf in Caledonia. This Tiny Pantry has the same needs as the Semcac Food Shelf. Donations of canned soups, canned fruit, saltine crackers, scalloped or AuGratin potatoes, cream of mushroom soup, cream of chicken soup, tomato sauce, diced tomatoes, stewed tomatoes, pancake mix and sugar.



#### **CROSSWALK**

On Good Friday, March 30 members of the Trinity Lutheran Church community will gather in the afternoon for a Crosswalk. This Crosswalk is symbolic of the walk Jesus took to his crucifixion and is intended as a public witness of faith.

We will begin at Trinity Church and make our way to different places/stations in the community representative of Holy Week events and ideas.

During the Crosswalk, all participants, young and old alike, will be given a chance to share in carrying the cross. Along the way, we will stop for short times of prayer, reading, and singing.

Please note that stations will be handicap accessible. Folks may drive between each station if they prefer. Start time for the Crosswalk is to be announced. All ages are welcome. All are welcome! (You do not need to be a Trinity member to participate.)


#### **GIRL SCOUT SUNDAY 2018**



## TRANSITION TEAM SURVEY December 2017

#### Background information on this survey:

There were concerns voiced by some congregation members that, given the size of our congregation, the council is not a good representation of the congregation.

Currently, our council is comprised of six voting members (Team leaders):

1) Care Ministry, 2) Education, 3) Mission in the World, 4) Outreach, 5) Support, and 6) Worship.

The council president also has a. The secretary, treasurer, and pastor all work in an "ex officio" capacity during council meetings.

Our question to the congregation was: How many council members do we presently need?

Below are the results of this survey. Seventy-one surveys were received.

No change in council size 21

Enlarge the council 50

Which Team Leaders should be added as voting members at Council meetings?

Finance 15

Property 6

Stewardship 7

Staffing 6

At-large increase 2

(an additional member, not from a specific team)

General increase 28

from 6 voting members to 8-10 voting members

(no team leader specified)

Some of the surveys wanted an increase in council size, but did not state which teams they wanted to be included in that increase.

Of the six teams mentioned in the opening information above, one team (Support) is composed of five "sub-teams" (Communications, Finance, Property, Staffing, and Stewardship).

Taking this into consideration and counting each of these as teams, Trinity has 10 total teams — Care, Education, Mission in the World, Outreach, Communications, Finance, Property, Staffing, Stewardship, and Worship.

**THE NEXT STEP....**The Support Team and representatives of the Excelling in Mission Team, which established our current council size, will review the survey results and make recommendations to the council.
