Dear friends in Christ.

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

I have been blessed to be your pastor, now, for a full calendar year AND a full church year. I have been by your side during moments of joy, like last Sunday when nearly 500 of us celebrated our risen Savior at two Easter services. I have also consoled many of you in your grief and sorrow, as you have also consoled me.

The first week, maybe even the first day that I arrived at the parsonage last year, the lovely Griffin family showed up on my porch with a basket of spring bulbs – tulips, narcissus, daffodils – that bloomed in their basket in my living room for several weeks. I couldn't know at the time that Phil and I would have great discussions about baseball, or that Kristi and I are distantly related on the Myrah side (and her sister was my freshman R.A. at Luther), and Isaac and Caleb would be my confirmands. I couldn't know so many things about how my first year as a pastor, as *your pastor*, would go.

Quite honestly, a new pastor really just wants to show up on time for all the right events, not offend anyone (if I have, I am so sorry), and preach the gospel. Preach the gospel always. It's also good, of course, to remind oneself with humility that God is in charge at all times, and to pray and listen for the voice of God in every decision.

After the blooms fell off the spring basket, I decided to plant the bulbs in front of the house. They rested there for a year. They were covered by leaves in the fall, then by snow all winter. Easter week, I thought I saw some green coming up, but I was too busy to investigate. Then, this week, I saw blooms. That beautiful gift from the Griffins is a gift again this year and hopefully for many years to come.

And that's when I realized that I am planted here, too. Like my lovely flowers, I have put down roots. And as I looked out at all of you last Sunday, I felt like I, too, was in bloom.

We take a risk when we plant, when we let ourselves be planted. But God is in charge of the church and its people as well as the sun and the rain. I hope we continue to sow the seeds of God's love together in this place for many years to come.

Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!


THIRST DAY IS MAY 30 — "Love Big Be Well: Letters to a Small-Town Church," Winn Collier

We'll discover what it means for a pastor and a church to do the slow work of ministry in community—anchored by a common place and buoyed by a life of faith that is meaningful, rooted, and true.




