Dear friends in Christ,

You get a lot of time to think when you're confined to your couch with the flu. Which is where I was most of the last couple of weeks. So I want to start out by thanking the many people who stopped by with soup and apples and chocolate, and all of you who sent me your good wishes and prayers. It means a lot.

You're supposed to drink plenty of liquids when you're sick, and that made me think of the other things we often thirst for. We thirst for knowledge about the Bible and our faith. We thirst for fellowship with our family of believers. And sometimes we thirst for time away from our busy lives to simply socialize with friends.

So I've decided to create an opportunity for some of those thirsts to be quenched. Beginning in January, I'm introducing a monthly "Thirst-Day." On the third Thursday of the month, at 7:30 p.m., I will host a "BYOB" get-together at the Parsonage for anyone interested in attending. It's not circle. It's not a club. You don't have to join anything. It's just a chance for us to get together and quench our collective thirst.

So what is the "B" in "BYOB"? Well, you should **B**ring **Y**our **O**wn ... **B**ible ... **b**ook you'd like to share ... topic that challenges your **b**elief ... or idea that makes you feel **b**lessed. Oh, and you should bring a **b**everage as well.

"Thirst-Day" will launch on January 17, and to get us started, I'm assigning a book to read, "Love Wins," by Rob Bell. Originally published in 2011, "Love Wins" addresses one of the most challenging topics of faith—hell and the afterlife—asking whether a loving God would really send people to eternal torment forever.

If you're thirsty for conversation about the Bible and topics of faith, I hope to see you for "Thirst-Day."


"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, **20** and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Matthew 28:19

These are the final verses of the Gospel of Matthew. They are one last command, urging, suggestion. As Christians we call these verses 'the Great Commission!' It is a task that we are left to fulfill. We are supposed to share our faith with each other and people we meet.

A few years ago, my family buried my Uncle Howard, who was a faithful man. As we gathered at the gravesite, I told the others how Howard knew all about salvation and redemption. Howard designed and made model airplanes.

For each plane he would take old cardboard from behind stores and design a box unique for the airplane he made. The dimensions were exact and the plane fit perfectly. Just as Jesus reclaimed us from the garbage of cast- out sin and recast us as children of God. My family looked at their shoes for a while and then began to tell funny stories about Uncle Howard, which is what we do to lighten things up.



We don't usually talk in this language or terms. I have heard people refer to it as God-talk, which is acknowledging how God works in our lives and in the world. For the most part we don't use those metaphors, phrases or language. For example, I am much more comfortable saying "Good Luck" rather than "God be with You." Right after it comes out of my mouth I feel pretty sheepish because I had a chance to share my faith and instead I regurgitate an empty phrase which means – nothing, encourages no one and would be better left unsaid. As if everything is chance and God isn't involved. But I keep blurting it out without thinking not wanting to offend anyone or embarrass them by bringing God into the conversation.

So why don't we talk about or share our faith? Is it a combination of embarrassment, being uncomfortable, not wishing to offend, or looking foolish, out of place? When something terrible happens, I am usually Ok to say I will pray for you, but too chicken to stop and actually pray with them at that time. 'My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus blood and righteousness.' Good Luck, errr, I mean God's blessings to you!

TRINITY HERITAGE ENDOWMENT FUND UPDATE

On October 14, 2018, the Heritage Endowment Committee met to discuss the Anna Rosendahl estate gift to Trinity from several years ago. Her gift was designated to be used only to aid in building a ground level addition to the church. It was disclosed that in 2007 the gift that had been in a savings account at Jennings State Bank was moved to the Heritage Endowment Fund. The \$93,0000 has been held ever since in that Trinity Heritage Endowment Asset Management Fund within the InFaith Community Foundation where it has grown to \$113,886.87.

Gifts to the Asset Management side of the Trinity Heritage Endowment are invested in perpetuity. Gifts that are designated to the Trinity Heritage Endowment Capital Fund can be spent when there is a project that meets the designation for which the gift was made. The committee felt that the original gift and its earnings since 2007 should be moved into a sub fund of the Capital Fund so that eventually it can be spent as Anna Rosendahl designated.

A motion was made and seconded and passed unanimously to move \$113,886.87 from the Asset Management side of the Trinity Heritage Endowment to the Capital Fund of the Trinity Heritage Endowment in a designated subaccount called *Rosendahl Capital Fund*.

This necessary action ensures that the Rosendahl gift with its growth earnings will be available for its designated use when it is needed. By moving these monies, the balance of the Heritage Endowment Asset Management Fund was decreased to \$526,138.00. That means that no income can be withdrawn from the fund this year and possibly for the next several years as well, depending on what happens with the market.


When the Trinity Endowment Asset Management Fund has grown to more than \$600,000, the Trinity Heritage Endowment Committee will again be able to recommend use of 80% of the income less the inflation rate over a three-year rolling average for property upkeep. The committee looks forward to receiving gifts and planned giving bequests which will more quickly grow this fund to more than \$600,000, and on to its original goal of \$1.5 million.

OCTOBER CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Motions approved:

- Group mission trip July 27-August 2, 2019 to Indianapolis for youth in grades 8-12.

- To add Lead Pastor, Treasurer, and Secretary as a voting member of the Congregation Council as recommended in the ELCA Model Constitution.
- The Facilities Use Policy with the changes discussed and a suggested donation for facility use of \$50, to be reviewed in one year.
- To accept the Gifts and Memorial Policy with the changes discussed.
- To accept the Ad Hoc Hiring Committee document with changes.
- Pr. Elizabeth's benefit package at the Silver Plan A rates for 2019 with a \$100/month HSA benefit.
- To begin direct deposit for payroll for all Trinity and Beary Patch staff.
- To pay the first boiler bill of \$96,935.40 from pledged funds.

Heating / Cooling Project update by the numbers

Total amount committed with donations and matching fund gifts = \$133,884!

Amount includes \$30,000 anonymous gift and \$10,000 gift from Norman Ellingson. Project goal is \$250,000.

Two new challenges —

- \$10,000 matching funds if we raise \$10,000 by Dec. 31, 2018. \$9,009 has already been given toward this challenge!
- Blue Hair Challenge Pastor Elizabeth will dye her hair blue for Advent if 100 new families donate to the boiler/AC fundraiser by November 30. Let's see our pastor with crazy hair! We have 62 donations toward this challenge so far! An envelope is included in this newsletter if you'd like to donate.

What's next? To strive to meet our project goal and if necessary to take out a loan, make it as small as possible to complete the project!

Donations to the heating / cooling project are still needed and do not have to be paid in one lump sum, they can be paid in installments.


