

BISHOP STEVEN DELZER WILL LEAD WORSHIP AT TRINITY ON OCTOBER 7!

We hope you plan to be in worship on Sunday, October 7, for this extra-special service with Holy Communion. As you know, Bishop Delzer is in his last year of service with our Southeast Minnesota Synod before he retires, and we are one of only a few churches at which he will preach during



this last year. The bishop will be preaching about our global ministries and partnerships and how we are all one global congregation in Christ Jesus.

This Sunday will also be our Mission Sunday with another **Noisy / Crinkly offering**. The proceeds from our Noisy / Crinkly offering will be used to support Lutheran ministries in South Sudan (saving the lives of pregnant women and infants) and Puerto Rico (hurricane relief). In a twist on our "First Fruits" initiatives, 10% of everything gathered will come back to Trinity to support the General Fund. So bring your pennies, nickels and dimes to worship because your change can make a big change in people's lives. And if you want it a little quieter, just throw in some of those crinkly dollars!

Dear friends in Christ.

I mentioned in my last letter how much I love this time of year. And as I write this today it only confirms how blessed we are to live in this part of the country. I know I'm biased, having been born and lived most of my life in Minnesota, but I think you don't find days like this too many other places. There's a brisk breeze that hints of falling leaves and football games to come. But it's also sunny and still warm enough that we don't have to wear a coat or turn on the furnace. I love it.

And speaking of furnaces (ba dum bah!), tremendous progress is being made on the boiler system project. If you've been tracking the progress on our Facebook or Instagram pages, you'll know that the asbestos abatement went very well, the energy audit went very well, the old system removal went very well, and the installation of the new boilers and piping is going very well!

But even better is the response of you, our members, to this massive undertaking. You have been supportive and cheerful as the Fellowship Hall was unavailable (and hurrah! – it's now mostly available again ... earlier than planned!) and meetings had to be moved upstairs. You've been understanding as we switched things around in the sanctuary. But most of all, you have been tremendously generous with your financial support.

As I write this letter, the congregation has pledged more than \$70,000 to fund the project. This means we will receive both of our matching pledges, of \$30,000 and \$10,000, respectively. Thank you, thank you, anonymous donor and Norman Ellingson! And we've managed to do this well ahead of our year-end deadline. So where do we go from here?

Well, we don't stop now, that's for sure. When we voted to take on this project, we assumed we'd have to borrow some of the funds. Because of your tremendous generosity, it's possible we could fund the entire project without borrowing. Let's keep going. Give what you can. And remember that this is an investment in our church building that you and your children and even your grandchildren will be able to enjoy for many, many years to come.

Heating / Cooling Project update by the numbers

\$71,425 committed donations as of 9/27/2018.

\$30,000 anonymous matching funds when we received \$60,000 in donations. \$10,000 matching funds from Norman Ellingson when we received an additional \$10,000.

Both goals have been met!

Total amount committed with donations and matching fund gifts = \$111,425! Project goal is \$250,000

What's next? To strive to meet our project goal and if necessary to take out a loan, make it as small as possible to complete the project!

Donations to the heating / cooling project are still needed and do not have to be paid in one lump sum, they can be paid in installments.
