What does it mean to be a "sanctuary church body"?

The ELCA, meeting in Milwaukee for Churchwide Assembly in August, became the first denomination to declare itself "a sanctuary church body." A variety of news channels have picked up on this story and chosen to tell it through their own lens. Here are some things to keep in mind as you evaluate the information you are hearing and choosing how to respond:

- The Churchwide Assembly's declaration that the ELCA is a sanctuary denomination binds only the ELCA Churchwide Organization; it does not bind congregations, synods, or other organizations.
- The Churchwide Assembly did not call for any illegal actions. All actions mentioned by the Churchwide Assembly are legal, and whether any person or organization chooses to engage in civil disobedience (and therefore accept the consequences) is up to them.

Each congregation will decide how and if it will be involved in sanctuary ministry. This decision by the Churchwide Assembly does not mandate or obligate congregations to do anything specifically. In its simplest form, becoming a sanctuary denomination means that the ELCA is publicly declaring that walking alongside immigrants and refugees is a matter of faith. When we preach on Sunday that Jesus told us to welcome, we are called to use our hands and voices on Monday to make sure it happens.

Some congregations are already doing sanctuary work. They are offering English as a second Language (ESL) classes, marching as people of faith against the detention of children and families, and providing housing for members facing deportation. Many congregations are hosting thoughtful conversations about what our faith says about immigration. To declare ourselves a sanctuary church body says that we seek to provide concrete resources to assist the most vulnerable who are feeling the sharp edges of the broken immigration system.

In 2016 the Churchwide Assembly established AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities) to walk alongside Central American children and families fleeing their communities. Through the AMMPARO strategy, *Welcoming Congregations* work on migration issues and welcome immigrants into their communities. Currently 151 welcoming and sanctuary congregations around the country form an active network. *Welcoming Congregations* support organizations and faith communities that work with deported migrants in Central America and advocate for the humane treatment of immigrants in Mexico. The ELCA also has five sanctuary synods, all of which do work with immigrants, refugees and asylum-

seekers. Through our global partners in Central America we work to alleviate the conditions that cause people to migrate.

In baptism, we are brought into a covenant relationship with Jesus Christ that commits us to strive for justice and peace in all the earth. Following the example of Martin Luther, we believe that advocacy is a crucial expression of baptismal identity. Welcoming people is not a political issue for us, it is a matter of faith.

Dear friends in Christ,

The Book of Revelation is considered strange and scary, but it contains some of the most beautiful passages in the Bible, especially when it comes to worship. Over and over, John's prophecy describes the throne of God surrounded by angels worshipping and singing and praising God. In fact, more hymns are based on passages from Revelation than any other book in the Bible except the Psalms. (If you want to learn more about Revelation, you're welcome to take the class I'll be teaching next spring as part of our Trinity U [formerly known as "confirmation"] program – adults are welcome!)

In the explanation to the Sacrament of Holy Baptism in the Small Catechism, Martin Luther tells us that "our sinful self ... should be drowned through daily repentance; and that day after day a new self should arise." Quoting Romans 6, Luther reminds us that baptism happens "daily," so that we "might walk in newness of life." By the grace of God, this newness is available to all of us in our baptism and every day.

September is upon us, and that means a whole lot of newness here at Trinity as well: New Sunday School and Trinity U programs, new children and youth joining these programs, new conversations and fellowship at Thirst Day, new songs to



hear from the Trinity choir and Bell Choir, celebrating new members on September 15, and several REALLY new members joining our Trinity family by baptism in early October. We have Rally Sunday and the WELCA Meatball Dinner to look forward to, as well as celebrating the wedding of Elizabeth Johnson and Andrew Houdek. And I'm sure I'm leaving some things out.

After nearly a year and a half as your pastor, I can't say I feel "new," but I still feel blessed and excited about serving you.

Motions approved:

- To designate the September Noisy Offering to AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities).
- To lease space in the Gathering Room at Trinity on Tuesdays, from 9-11a.m. for 6 weeks for Living Well with Chronic Conditions.
- To approve the recommendation of the Property Team to accept Expert Insulations proposal for insulating the entire attic (chancel ceiling, floor below bell tower, sanctuary ceiling) for a total cost of \$7,939.

Updates:

- •Care Ministry Team will be hosting a Wisdom Luncheon on Sunday, October 6 for Trinity members age 80 and over. Invitations will be sent out soon.
- Indianapolis Mission Trip youth will be sharing their experiences with the congregation on Stewardship Sunday, September 29.
- Wind has caused some damage to the steeple. Krause Konstruction looked at the steeple, main roof, and chimney and cost estivates were: steeple (\$58,000), main roof (\$350,000-\$375,000), and removal of chimney (\$8,220).



CHURCHWIDE ASSEMBLY 2019 IN REVIEW

Our denomination, the ELCA, holds a churchwide assembly triennially – to worship, vote on matters of governance and policy, and be church together for the sake of the world. This year's churchwide assembly was full of important votes and actions, including:

- Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton was reelected for a second six-year term on the first ballot.
- A declaration of apology to our siblings of African descent, which was received by the African Descent Lutheran Association with thanks and a call for accountability and living into the words shared.
- Approved resolution declaring the ELCA is a "sanctuary church body," encouraging participation in the ELCA AMMPARO initiative for migrant children, discernment of care for our immigrant neighbors in our context, and the promise of forthcoming resources for this work.
- Approved support for the World Council of Church's Thursdays in Black, awareness movement for a world without rape and violence.
- Voted to commemorate June 17 as a day of repentance, in honor and remembrance of the martyrdom of the Emanuel 9.
- Approved a declaration for inter-religious commitment, reaffirming ecumenical and interfaith partnerships.
- Approved the recommendations from a strategic taskforce which has been studying how to work toward authentic diversity in our church.
- Approved memorials: affirming but not "endorsing" the Poor People's Campaign, care for immigrants and refugees, and other statements.
- Adopted a new social statement, "Faith, Sexism, and Justice: a Lutheran Call to Action," and its implementing resolutions.
- Deacon Sue Rothmeyer was elected Churchwide Secretary, a full-time position which acts as executive administrator and leader on all constitutional matters and interpretation.
- Constitutional change for Deacons (rostered ministers of word and service) to be ordained, from the previous practice of consecration.
- Celebrated the milestones of 50 years of women's ordination, 40 years since the first woman of color was ordained, and 10 years since full inclusion of LGBTQIA+ clergy.
