From Pastor Elizabeth

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the live everlasting. Amen.

Dear people of Christ,

As we work our way through this year's Lenten theme, "Altered by the Spirit," based on the Book of Acts, it reminds me that we acknowledge the Holy Spirit's action in and on our lives every time we recite the Apostle's Creed, our confession of faith, during our worship services.

In Martin Luther's Small Catechism, he highlights the work of the Holy Spirit on us as "sanctification," to differentiate from the work of God the Father (creation) and God the Son (redemption). When the Holy Spirit works on us, we are sanctified by our faith through grace. What does this mean?

As Luther writes, it means for each of us that "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith." This, I tell all our confirmation students, is all you need to know.

Beginning in our baptism, we are changed ... altered ... by the work of the Holy Spirit. Indeed, the Apostle's Creed comprises a significant part of the baptismal service. As the great theologian Will Willamon states, baptism is "a one-time event that takes a lifetime to complete." Because the Holy Spirit never stops working on us. And because we are changed ... altered ... it means the Holy Spirit also works *through* us.

It is because of the work of the Spirit on us that we receive gifts. As the Apostle Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 12: "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." (1 Cor. 12:4-7).

"For the common good" reminds us that all of us are called to use our gifts – whatever they may be – on behalf of our neighbor. To love God, and to love our neighbor.

The Spirit is with us, in us, and around us, and goes before us whatever we do, wherever we are. During this season of Lent, let us celebrate that Jesus promised a comforter, an advocate, and a friend to be with us. The Holy Spirit does all that – and more!

May God the Spirit be with you. ~ Pr. Elizabeth



JANUARY 10, 2024 CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- Education Team Wednesday Bible School will be at Trinity Center and Sunday School will resume in January at church on Sunday mornings taught by Pr. Lane Zaffke.
- Staffing Team Gave out ESST handout showing new compliance regulations for 2024. At this time, no new applications for Youth Director position. Betty will be attending career fairs in February 2024.
- Stewardship Team Need to increase giving 1-2% per household would go a long way toward budget. Average household income in SG School District is \$60,000. 20% of people give 2/3 of the budget and 80% of people give the other 1/3 of the budget with their annual giving.
- Windows Update 3 on west side are done, still working on front windows. Storms will be done in the spring.
- Steeple Project update Ornaments possibly will be done the end of March 2024 (weather dependent), no asbestos on steeple slate. Pricing will not change, as it was a set bid. Roof is still good and should last approximately 20 years, but trim and painting need to be done.
- Master Planning Committee update Pastor Elizabeth and Jacque Wennes are working with Kodet on 2025 pricing as well as Mission Builders availability and pricing. Tombstone location is planned to tentatively be done this spring.
- 2024 100th Anniversary of Release Time program. Education and Worship will be working on this event.

MOTIONS PASSED

- to approve the PTO/Holiday/ESST Policy to become effective 1/1/2024.
- to approve membership in the Spring Grove Area Chamber of Commerce.

FEBRUARY 14, 2024 CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- Welcomed our new council members to their first council meeting: Lorilyn Dehning, Autumn Wiste, Heather Gray, Barb Gulbranson (Jessi Strinmoen in Barb's place), and Sheri Allen (on her way home from Spain).
- Care Team had training for bulk ordering. This will save funds by buying in large quantities. Currently serving 23 youth for the HIP program every weekend. Team would like to move HIP program to Trinity Center due to proximity of school. Due to large amount of usage, may reach out in future to area churches for financial assistance if needed.
- Finance Team PTO being calculated manually on a spreadsheet for ESST program. Looking at 2024 Congregation reporting changes for SEMN Synod since they are on a different fiscal year. Not on a calendar year. According to a Vanco report, people are more likely to pay for a specific special project instead of general day-today operations.
- Property Team currently working to raise the height of the island in the kitchen of the parsonage. Estimated cost is around \$500.
- Staffing Team Working on ideas for ways to find new Youth Director. Attending Career Fairs in La Crescent and at WTC in La Crosse. Still running radio ads with Decorah stations for Youth Director position. Church staff evaluations have been revamped and will take place after Lenten Season.
- Piecemakers Quilting Guild has rented the Trinity Center for Thursday Sunday of Syttende Mai festival.
- Narcotics Anonymous (NA) will be using Trinity Center on Friday nights for their meetings.



THANK YOU FOR SUPPORTING THE PHONATHON

On Feb. 13 (coincidentally on Fat Tuesday itself!), 14 youth took over the Fellowship Hall for a successful phonathon fundraising effort. This was a joint effort of Trinity Lutheran Church, Wilmington Lutheran Church, and Faith Lutheran Church of Black Hammer.

We kicked off the efforts with a 1-hour phonathon training. We reminded the youth that the purpose of the phonathon was two-fold: of course to raise money to support the trip, but also to connect with our membership, sharing stories about past gatherings and youth events. We reviewed the script and practiced the calls while using bananas in place of phones. The kids were ready (although a little nervous!).

The youth were asked to come to the phonathon with names of their family and friends from outside the congregation. They started with these calls, and then moved on to the membership lists from

the three congregations. In 2 hours, they completed 160 calls, with over 99% of people they talked to making a pledge for a donation. They were highly motivated by the prizes expected for the most calls completed (20), the highest single pledge received (\$502), and the donation from the farthest away (Anchorage, AK). Anytime the youth received a pledge for \$100 or more, they were able to steal the traveling stuffed gorilla from wherever it sat. When the timer went off, whomever had the gorilla won a prize.

With a \$5,000 match in place, the youth secured an additional \$13,000 in pledges for a total of \$18,000 raised!

While the youth worked tirelessly through the 2-hour window, they were not able to make it very far into the membership lists. We hope that you'll consider making a donation to support them anyway! And if you'd like a call from a youth, please just let the church office know.

Our challenge now is to collect on the pledges made. We have received more than 50% of the expected pledges, and have sent a follow-up mailing to those who have not made their donation yet. So if you promised a donation, please make sure to turn your donation in soon!

The estimated costs of the trip are about \$2,000/person. Our goal is to raise enough to cover the entire cost of the trip for each attendee (minus the \$350 deposit they have already made). In addition to the phonathon, the attendees will be hosting a Lenten Supper on March 13, participating in the Easter Brunch and Syttende Mai Meatball Dinner, hosting coffee fellowship in May, and hosting a meal with Music and Market on June 19.


