

(2 Corinthians 4:6 NRSV)

Perhaps it seems odd, but I have been thinking a lot about sorrow lately. This December and last brought with them the unexpected deaths of people my husband and I have known and loved. We have now journeyed through two Advents marked by grief.

In the midst of sitting in that grief, I have watched on Sunday mornings as the light on the Advent wreath grows. Many of us name the Advent promises of hope, peace, joy, and love as the candles are lit. Often, we do not recognize that those candles are sometimes ignited in the backdrop of loneliness, uncertainty, grief, and fear.

Indeed, all of those things have always mingled together. They were present at the moment of Christ's birth, and they are present in our lives still today.

As I have watched the light from the candles around the Advent wreath grow, I have thought about other candles we often hold in sacred spaces. At baptism, we light a candle from the Christ candle and hand it to a sponsor of the newly baptized, proclaiming, "Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven."

I have been thinking a lot about the Christ light we each hold, whether literally in our baptismal candles or figuratively, as the gospel takes hold of us and the light of Christ shines in our hearts and lives. I remember the way the light in a room grows when we are all gathered in one space, holding our baptismal candles, our Christ lights, for one another to see.

Indeed, many of us have Christmas memories of singing Silent Night as we pass the flame from one candle to the next. As the light is shared, the sanctuary transforms, and a room full of individual lights becomes a space of communal light.

As I think about the people I love who navigate the deepest seas of grief this season, I also think about the light of Christ and the ways we are called and privileged to bear the Christ light for one another.

It is true that if there were only one light, and it was the light of Christ, it would be enough to break through the deepest night. It is also true that as the number of candles grows, so too does the light. Sometimes it is through the work of God in others, as they bear the light, that we see the light of Christ.

Dear church, this Christmas, I pray two things: first, that you would be surrounded, either in spirit or in the flesh, by a host of people who hold the Christ light for you.

Second, I pray that all of us would bear the light that points to the "glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." I pray the light we hold would indeed be the light of Christ and that the light would only grow as we each, individually and communally, let our lights so shine before others that they may see and glorify the One who came... and is... and will come again. The One who is the light of the world.

May the light of Christ shine brightly upon you and in you this Christmas season.

Dearest people of God,

God's grace and peace and blessings to you as we begin another new year! As I write this, much has changed since last year at this time. We have had in-person worship since March, and we have had in-person Sunday School and confirmation this school year as well. In December, we were blessed to present both a Sunday School Christmas program and the annual Trinity Choir concert (both available for viewing on our YouTube channel "Trinity Lutheran: Spring Grove," if you missed them). Then, to celebrate for the 2021st time, we had three services on Christmas Eve with well over 200 people attending (and many more attending online), as well as a service on Christmas Day. As I said, much has changed.

And yet, some things have not changed. We are still fighting a pandemic that has taken the lives of more than 800,000 people in the U.S., and millions more around the world, including several Trinity members and several more in the community. We mourn these losses, and we pray for an end to the pandemic.

But there is one thing that never changes: We are called to love our neighbor as ourselves, as Jesus loves us. And we are called to love "the least of these" in order to show our love for Jesus.

We know that Jesus comes to us not just at Christmas but every day. Jesus comes to us in the music, liturgy, and scripture we hear in worship. Jesus comes to us in the waters of baptism and the bread and wine of communion. But most of all, most precious of all, Jesus comes to us in the people we meet every day. And we show Jesus to the people we meet every day in our words and actions.

As we look ahead to 2022, I have faith that we will continue to see Jesus and be Jesus for our Trinity family, for our community, and for the community at large. Thank you for your faith in this congregation. Thank you for your support of the mission of this church. And thank you for your continued faith in doing the work God is calling us to do in the world.

So when you wash your face everyday to start the day, keep in mind that you are renewing your baptism everyday.

- income sources for 2021 (donations or where income was generated)
- expenses (list of expenses and when paid check #, etc.)
- any accounts payable bills for backup of the items paid
- a balance sheet and profit and loss statement as of 12/31/2021 that he can balance your accounts to.

It seemed it'd be a night like any other this semester- a student leader meeting around the big table in the LCC kitchen, and wonderful supporters bringing in a meal halfway through the meeting. I should have known better. After all, longtime LCC friend and former Vice President Shirley draws people together. She, Jodie, and Gina brought in bags and baskets of vegetables, chips, buns, desserts, fixings, and on and on-- and so much good gluten-free food!

Gina's children and a couple of their friends popped into the kitchen just before dinner, and soon the place was buzzing! I was surprised as more students came through the doors- a couple who had been coming the last few weeks also brought two new friends, and another student I hadn't seen since the first week of school, arrived later.

During worship that evening, we pulled tables together again, just like we had for dinner, and worked on making and writing Christmas cards for children and families in U.S. detention centers. (This was the second year in a row we participated in Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service's "Hope for the Holidays" campaign.) I was so thankful that this was the week of the semester (aside from that first one, of course!) that so many people showed up.

One newer student looked up Christmas jokes on her phone to include in her cards, thinking of the children who would open them later. Several students began a deeper conversation of welcome, noting how often they'd felt unwelcome in churches and how surprised they were to find a place like the LCC. As we were wrapping up, I told them that these were exactly the kind of conversations we have at Independent Theo, and one of them came the very next Tuesday!





My prayer for you, among many, is that you may trust the welcome that is yours at the manger of Jesus this season and all the year through. Merry Christmas, dear ones.

Greetings and Merry Christmas from the Jacobsons, 2021!

We are currently ensconced in a beautiful cabin in the north woods, surrounded by snow and pine trees, reminiscent of Christmases past. We've been blessed to be able to gather as a family here: Laura and James from New York, Sarah and Stéphane from Nantes, France, and Mark, Linda and Katherine from St. Paul.

We just celebrated Mark's 70th birthday as a family and now continue to explore the way forward for brain cancer treatments. Many of you have been following our journey on Caring Bridge following Mark's diagnosis with brain cancer (https://www.caringbridge.org/visit/daktarijacobson). Mark's best birthday present was having two separate oncologists agree on recommendations for the best treatment going forward.

Mark and Linda have been occupied with treatment planning and the treatment itself. Mark did radiation and chemo through the summer, which was well tolerated, but the cancer is still here to deal with. We appreciate living near extended family and friends in Minnesota and the tremendous support they give. Mark is semi-retired but continues to do some consulting for the ELCA, especially around healthcare in Juba, Sudan, and in Bangladesh. He is working with the Cancer Care Center at KCMC, Moshi, and the Foundation for Cancer Care in Tanzania on plans for adding brain cancer care to their work. Linda is on leave from her volunteer work with sexual assault survivors at Ramsey County.

After we got our Covid vaccines, we were able to return home to Tanzania from April to June to visit our home church and lifelong friends. The highlight of the year was our middle daughter Sarah's wedding at her husband Stéphane's family home in Brittany, France this September. We went sailing, ate our fill of oysters, dined in the beautiful streets of Vannes, stayed in the lovely seaside family home where Stéphane spent his summers growing up, and got to practice our French with the many wonderful members of Stéphane's family. We are so grateful that they arranged the timing so that Mark was able to be there.

Laura and James live in New York City. Laura works with data at New York City Health + Hospitals and James is a career coach at Columbia University. This year they've enjoyed catching up with friends and the chance to eat indoors again.


