

M OUR PASTOR

And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." He who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making everything new! ... To the thirsty I will give water without cost from the spring of the water of life. ...

On no day will gates [of the city] ever be shut, for there will be no night there.

Revelation 21:3-5a.6b.25

Dear people of God,

I have always loved these words from the Book of Revelation. The Book gets a bad rap as being full of scary monsters and doomsday messages. But it's actually a letter written by John (or one of his disciples) to seven real churches in Asia. John had been exiled to the island of Patmos, likely for his persistence in preaching and teaching about Jesus. The Book is full of worship and praise and hope and invitation, and more hymns have been written based on passages from the Book than any other Book of the Bible save the Psalms. Hymns such as "When the Saints Go Marching In," and "Holy, Holy," and many others.

John writes to the young churches, under foreign rule by Rome, because they were struggling in various ways to uphold their faith in Jesus. Some faced persecution and some hardship. But others were either overly passionate in their faith and so succumbing to harsh judgment of each other – they didn't love enough – while others were "lukewarm" in their faith. John implores each of them to listen to the Spirit and to persevere and so receive the crown of life.

The Congregation Council is currently reading and studying the Book. It's an ideal Book to read as we continue to come out of the COVID pandemic because it cautions us not to be complacent while also offering us consolation and hope for the future. If anyone else would like to read and study the Book together, I'd be overjoyed to lead a Bible Study with you.

In the passage quoted above, John sees a vision of Jesus seated on the throne saying "See, I am making everything new." This is a powerful promise for us! First, because it's written in the

present tense – the "new" making is an ongoing process that Jesus is engaged in all the time! There are always more opportunities for us to be made new.

And second, because it reminds us of our baptism, and the daily "newness of life" promised in those forgiving waters.

Mark your calendars now: On Saturday and Sunday, September 18 and 19, Trinity will host a special weekend of Celebration and Renewal. It will begin with Saturday communion worship at 5 p.m. here at the church and continue with a special concert with music from the Trinity choir, small groups, and soloists, plus other community members, all based on the Revelation theme "See, I Am Making Everything New." The concert will be at the Fest Building, as will Sunday worship at 9:15 a.m., followed by fellowship and Rally Sunday for the Sunday School kids.

As we look back on more than a year of sacrifice, loss, and hardship because of the COVID pandemic, we are called to remind ourselves that God is with us, and God promises for all of us to be made new.





INVISIBLE!

Ever wonder what it would be like to be invisible? Besides the practical jokes like saying something and everyone looking around saying "Who said that?" But they don't know, because you are invisible. Or when someone slips into line ahead of you. No, I am talking about if no one sees you, at all. It happens. Mary and I happened to watch a little TV. We don't have regular TV at home so it was a unique experience. There was a commercial about invisible

people. In the commercial it showed people who were being left out. People who were left out of celebrations, dinners, coffee, any kind of gathering. They were standing off to the side and not included. As the maker of the commercial wanted, it was very sad. No reason they should be left out, but they were.

There are lots of reasons in our world why people can be left out. Sometimes we choose to be left out, other times it is chosen for us. It is not just because of perhaps skin color or sex although they are reasons people are left out. It could also be because of age, religion, depression, physical appearance, and the list goes on. Groucho Marx once said 'I don't want to be part of a group that would want me as a member.' He could be caustic and he was Jewish so he knew what it was like to be shunned. There is always a sad truth to humor.



I took a group of youth on a canoe trip years ago. As part of our learning, the other pastor and I thought it would be good to pick a person that should be shunned by the group. We picked the most outgoing personable girl in the group. It really bothered her and she became so frustrated at being treated invisible she began to be a monster. Instead of an hour we cut it off at 20 minutes. It was a pretty effective learning time though for all of us.

Jesus was always mindful of the invisible people in the Gospels. He saw the lepers, the women, the depressed and insane, the physically challenged, even the crooks. Jesus noticed them and saw them as children of God. While people all around shunned them or didn't see them or notice them, Jesus talked to them, honored them, valued them, healed them, forgave them. Jesus even noticed the rich man wanting to get into heaven. We need to be mindful of others as Jesus was and is. We now are Jesus' hands and love in ministry. Look for the invisible people around you. They are there, you just haven't seen them yet!

MAY 12, 2021 CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Updates:

- Pastor Len and I were able to meet with K-4th graders from school for Release Time education in the months of April and May. We'll finish up on May 26.
- Trinity will host Baccalaureate for graduating seniors on Wednesday, June 2 at 7:00 p.m.
- Care Team placed a big order from Channel One to help with packing meals for the school back packs and have Red's grocery cards available in the Good Samaritan Fund.
- Facility Planning Team met with architect a couple of weeks ago and met last week. A couple of tweaks need to be made to the blueprints.
- Security update: started locking the church doors on May 3, 2021.
- Synod Assembly met May 8 via Zoom and it went well. The Synod Assembly attendees from Trinity were Pr. Elizabeth, Michelle Jahnke, Rachel Udstuen, and Willy Leafblad. Trinity sent in \$1000 for our Synod Offering, which was budgeted. Two people are serving at the Synod Jonah Udstuen is representative on the Synod Youth Jackie Wennes is representative to Consultation Committee.

JUNE 9, 2021 CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Updates:

- 8 families signed up for Wednesday night VBS in June
- resignations: Bekah Leafblad, Director of Children, Youth, and Family position due to moving from Spring Grove; Lorilyn Dehning, bookkeeper; Willy Leafblad, handbell choir director.
- Mission Team reported on disbursements from donations to the Missionary for a Day candle: \$1,040 to Jacobson Missions, \$500 to Lutheran Campus Ministry in Winona, \$500 to Good Earth Village.
- Waiting on a bid for cement work to be done at the parsonage
- preliminary blueprints for church addition presented to council from the Visioning and Planning Team. This team will talk to the architect/contractor for a quoted price and will then bring it to the congregation.

Motions passed:

- to increase insurance coverage to \$4.5 million. This is an extra \$1,500/year premium for all properties Trinity Center, parsonage, church. (The Worship Team will determine a value of the organ, at which time another change to the policy may be necessary.)
- to renew Pastor Lane Zaffke's one-quarter time contract at the salary proposed in the 2021 budget.
- to have the Landsom Brothers remove 12 trees (8 ash, 4 pine) at the parsonage.

MUSIC MINISTRY TASKFORCE

The Music Ministry Taskforce was formed to review Trinity's music ministry; it's rich past, current offerings and possibilities for the future. The Taskforce completed their work in May and shared findings at the June Council meeting. The Council heard specific details and ideas to consider as well as progress on the recommendations for the Worship and Staffing Teams.

The Music Taskforce (MTF) proposed four areas for further consideration by the pastor, Worship Team, and others involved in Music Ministry. Areas included: 1) highlighting current Music Ministry, 2) integrating musical talent throughout the service, 3) enhancing contemporary worship service and, 4) increasing participation in Music Ministry.

The MTF also made two recommendations for the pastor, Finance, Staffing and Worship Teams: 1) a review of our Music Ministry budget including current staffing and projected needs and, 2) an evaluation of the planning and scheduling process for Music Ministry.

Challenges identified by MTF members and a survey of music leaders and members participating in music ministry included: a) recruitment of individuals for all aspect of Music Ministry, b) commitment required for participation in all aspects of Music Ministry and, c) competing obligations for all age groups and families who participate or consider participating in Music Ministry.

The MTF acknowledged the many contributions of those with musical gifts at Trinity and the considerable talents of our music leaders. The MTF concluded that music has been and will continue to be central to worship at Trinity.

Members of the Taskforce included: J Kraabel (chair), B. Fried, K. Kapplinger, W. Leafblad, M. Schroeder, R. Storlie and J. Tollefsrud.


