



Dear people of God,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father, and from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

As I write this, I am preparing for outdoor worship this Sunday, and I am also listening to the blessed sounds of our Vacation Bible School and Day Camp youth sing, pray, shout, and play throughout the church building and outdoors. These two activities represent opposite emblems of our lives for the last two years. Outdoor worship is something we can now choose to do (rather than doing it because we have to); and VBS and Day Camp are something we get to do, when for the last two years we haven't been able to. "The old has gone, the new is here!"

A few months ago, I attended an online seminar for pastors, and I wrote down this quote from one of the leaders: "In the rush back to normal (after the COVID-19 pandemic), we ought to consider what are the things about 'normal' we want to rush back to." And that leads to a further question: Of the things we changed because of the pandemic, what are the things we'd like to keep?

I have a few ideas. For example, outdoor worship was something we could do more safely during these last two years, when previously it was something we did just once a year for fun. But we live in one of the most glorious areas of the world, so outdoor worship is something we can do more often so we can enjoy God's good creation while worshipping God. Plus, Lee and Rick built us a fantastic outdoor pulpit!

Facebook Live is another resource we added (along with Zoom for meetings) during the pandemic. And now, though we can meet in person again, Facebook enables us to reach more people than ever for worship, just as we've always done with our radio ministry. And Zoom allows us to host meetings even when members are traveling or need to be at home for one reason or another.

By the way, did you know that our total attendance each Sunday is the same as it was before the pandemic? But now people have more choices and opportunities to worship with us. Some choose to be here in-person. Some choose to worship at home, or from their campers, or from their vacation homes. As I always say, it's a blessing to have you worshipping with us however you are able to join us.

Martin Luther said "Here I stand. I can do no other." But Luther didn't stand still. And neither did Jesus. He was on the go during his entire ministry.

We are a church of the Reformation, a church called by Jesus to respond to the needs of our neighbors. And now we can go where our neighbors are, wherever they are, whoever they are, on a Sunday morning.

I would love to hear from you about other ways Trinity is called to respond to this changing world. "The old has gone, the new is here!" Thanks be to God.

WINDOW CHALLENGE: CAN PR. E LEAD WORSHIP WITH RED, GREEN, OR WHITE HAIR?

Maintenance on our glorious stained-glass windows is #1 on the Master Plan priority list (see the May/June newsletter). There are already some funds set aside for this big project, but we know we will need more. This week, a generous donor offered to match up to \$30,000 in donations pledged by the congregation. What a blessing!

We have two outstanding bids for the window project. This week, Dan Alstad (Property Team Lead), Jacque Wennes (Master Plan Committee Interim Lead) and I (Pr. Elizabeth) met with a third company. We expect to receive a project plan from them within a month. Our goal is to schedule a congregational meeting later this year to approve the project and to complete the windows in 2023.

But first things first. I (Pr. Elizabeth) would like to challenge us to meet our donor's pledge goal by September 1 of this year. And to add an additional incentive, if we receive \$30,000 in pledged donations from congregation members by September 1, I will again dye my hair a liturgical color. And the first person in the congregation to pledge at least \$1,000 gets to choose which color! Blue has already been done (remember the boiler?!). The remaining liturgical colors are green, white, and red.

MAY 10, 2022 CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Updates:

- The school is forming a pre-K program and Bethany Bergsgaard will be the director. The Beary Patch board of directors is meeting in late May to determine next steps for Beary Patch.
- Last day of Sunday School is May 8, singing at the nursing home at 10:30 a.m.; last day of Wednesday School is May 25; last day of Confirmation is May 25.
- Our youth will be leading the Meatball Dinner on Sunday, May 15. Senior Recognition Sunday is May 22.
- High School Bonfires will be most Wednesdays this summer on the church lawn from 8-10 p.m. Tennis Tuesdays for 7th-12th grade youth will be the first Tuesday of June, July, and August, from 7-9 p.m.
- Confirmation Camp at Good Earth Village for 7th-9th grade youth is July 10-15. High School youth summer service trip is July 24-29 at Sugar Creek Bible Camp. Day Camp and VBS will be June 20-23.
- Outreach Team delivered Glazer Donuts to the local daycares on May 5 and May 6 as a random act of kindness.
- Boiler at Trinity Center. Looking for parts to fix boiler. Received two bids: \$25,000 and \$24,000.
- Staffing Team have been working on face-to-face evaluations with staff members.
- Reminder if you have a receipt to turn in to the bookkeeper to fill out and attach an expense report.
- Master Planning Committee/Facility Planning reported that two projects need to be done before going forward with an addition -1) stained glass windows on the south side of the building, 2) steeple it is losing slate shingles. It was recommended to hire a project manager.
- Rev. Emily Carson, Assistant to the Bishop Director of Evangelical Mission, will be coming to a council meeting to share a brief presentation on benevolence and giving, and to thank us for our gifts to the greater church.

Motions passed:

• To authorize Congregation President, Saundy Solum, and Treasurer, Steve Nelson, to access funds, to authorize Bookkeeper, Nichole Krenzke, to inquire and view the account, and to remove Barb Arnold and Marlene Deschler from the account.

JUNE 8, 2022 CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Updates:

- The Beary Patch board of directors met and there will be no Beary Patch programming in the 2022-23 school year. Bethany Bergsgaard has been hired to direct the school's new 4K program.
- Education Team is serving dinner June 8 at Music in the Park. Fundraiser for Education & Youth Ministry.
- Education Team will be refilling/restocking/cleaning out the children's coloring bags in the sanctuary.
- We served 570 meatball dinners and brought in \$4,979 for the Youth Luther League account!
- Care Ministry Team had a site visit with Channel 1 at the Trinity Center. The food is stored in the furnace room in the Trinity Center. Channel 1 said that Laurie Moen (team lead) needed to take a food safety test. Laurie took the test and passed.
- Trinity received a phone call from Sugar Creek stating that they do not have enough counselors to lead Trinity's Day Camp. Kerri is working on a different plan. Day Camp will be happening at Trinity.
- Stewardship Team still needs volunteers to help serve refreshments following outdoor worship on July 31. Peggy Landsom is making the meal and needs people to help serve.
- Fall Retreat for all Team members: Sunday, October 2 at Giants of the Earth, II:00 a.m.—2:30 p.m., lunch will be served. Retreat for all team members.
- Burying electrical wires in old cemetery over \$30,000 quoted to have this done and cannot do for a couple of years. This is a city job. Saundy will meet with the city for a firm number.
- Pr. Elizabeth met with an anonymous donor who asked for needs for the church. She mentioned the windows project. The donor offered that they will match up to 30k of what we can raise.
- The parsonage porch is deteriorating. Gary Wilhelmson got a bid from the lumber company: \$3,350 for the porch, an additional \$870 for underneath framework, \$395 for the facia. Total, if all this needed to be done: \$4,615. Only \$2,000 in the budget.

Motions passed:

• To winterize the Trinity Center by September 1 as long as we have a place for Release Time.

To hire Kerri full-time. Stated that the salary would be around \$8,000 more for the year.

To get funds from Special Accounts to cover repairs to the parsonage porch that are above what is in the budget.

A Gentler, Better Way to Change Minds: Stop wielding your values as a weapon and start offering them as a gift.

Research shows that changing minds, especially changing beliefs that are tied strongly to people's identity, is extremely difficult. The way that people tend to argue today, particularly online, makes things worse. Disagreements can feel like a war in which the fighters dig trenches on either side of any issue and launch their beliefs back and forth like grenades.

Odds are that neither camp is having any effect on the other; on the contrary, attacks make opponents dig in deeper. If you want a chance at changing minds, you need a new strategy: Stop using your values as a weapon and start offering them as a gift.

Extensive survey-based <u>research</u> has revealed that almost everyone shares <u>at least two common values</u>: Harming others without cause is bad, and fairness is good. But even when two groups agree on a moral foundation, they can radically disagree on how it should be expressed.

The solution requires a change in the way we see and present our own values. If we want any chance at persuasion, we must offer them happily. A weapon is an ugly thing, designed to frighten and coerce. A gift is something we believe to be good for the recipient, who, we hope, may accept it voluntarily, and do so with gratitude. That requires that we present it with love, not insults and hatred. Here are three steps to make this easier.

- **1. Don't "other" others.** When people feel excluded from a community, they can become hostile toward that community. Go out of your way to welcome those who disagree with you as valued voices, worthy of respect and attention. There is no "them," only "us." Bring them into your circle to hear your views, as long as doing so would not invite and reward abuse.
- **2. Don't take rejection personally.** When someone dismisses your beliefs, that can feel like they're dismissing *you*. But just as you are not your car or your house, you are not your beliefs. The first step helps you prove to yourself that you can love someone with whom you disagree; this step is about knowing they can do the same with you.
- **3. Listen more.** According to research undertaken by social scientists at Yale and UC Berkeley, when it comes to changing someone's mind, <u>listening</u> is more powerful than talking. And listening with empathy is a gift. If someone is verbally abusing you, the best course of action is not to engage at all. But when possible, listening and asking sensitive questions almost always has a more beneficial effect than talking.

But for your values to truly be a gift, you must weaken your own belief attachment first. This is the argument of the late Buddhist master Thich Nhat Hanh. As he taught, we should all <u>promise to ourselves</u>, "I will cultivate openness, non-discrimination, and non-attachment to views in order to transform violence, fanaticism, and dogmatism in myself and in the world."

Making such a promise is hard. But if I truly have the good of the world at heart, then I must not fall prey to the conceit of perfect knowledge and must be willing to entertain new and better ways to serve my ultimate goal: creating a happier world. Generosity and openness have a bigger chance of making the world better in the long run.




