

Joy is defined as a state of being in the mind and heart; whereas, happiness is the result of an external circumstance. Thus, receiving a book on joy can make me happy. It is written by Douglas Abrams, who is Jewish; he



documented a weeklong meeting of His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu of the Catholic Church.

The word 'joy' appears in the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible 164 times. I am not sure how many times 'joy' appears in other translations. In John 17:13 Jesus says in his last discourse with his disciples, "but now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves." So, it is that Jesus had a sense of this long ago. Perhaps that is the Lutheran in me that first checks to see how this will square up with Biblical Scripture.

The premise is how a person can have 'joy' in heart and mind in all situations of life. Jesus spoke of 'joy' on the eve of the Crucifixion. He knew what was in store for him wasn't good, but still lived in 'joy.' The book is all about trying to live 'joy' in today's world.

Dear friends in Christ,

I'm sitting at my desk watching the Day Campers on the lawn, and I'm very tempted to go out and join them. Every year for many years, I went with my cousins, Kari and Nancy, and my best friend, Susan, to Riverside Bible Camp in Story City, IA. It was the best week of the summer for me. One year, we even went twice! I still have so many of the camp songs memorized, and sometimes when I'm studying a particular part of scripture, one of those songs will come rushing back. As anyone who heard me sing "1 John 4:7 and 8" in worship will recall! I loved Bible Camp growing up, and I'm so excited that we have so many youth participating in summer faith programs at Trinity.

Last week, 12 seventh graders from Trinity attended Confirmation Camp at Good Earth Village with Bekah. I spent most of Wednesday with them, starting with chapel, Trinity time, and a trail lunch. I especially enjoyed Trinity time, listening to the students thoughtfully express their questions about faith and science and scripture. These kids are smart and serious, and I can't wait to be with them in Confirmation this fall.

This week, there are 63 younger kids attending Vacation Bible School in the morning and Day Camp in the afternoon. Those of you in worship last Sunday got to hear (and see) our four counselors from Sugar Creek, who are helping out this week, perform "Peace Like a River." Even from my desk here, I can see that the kids have energy and enthusiasm for their faith as these great counselors lead them in song.

And next week we bless and send 26 of our high school youth to Houston for the ELCA Youth Gathering. I hope you'll all be at worship early (before the hymn sing) when we have a special blessing for them. I also remember attending a Lutheran Youth Gathering in New Orleans when I was in High School. The kids will sing and learn and pray with tens of thousands of Lutheran youth from all over the country. I know it will be an experience they'll never forget. And thank you to all the pray-ers who signed up for Trinity Prays.

There are more than 100 (101 to be exact!) Trinity youth, from little ones to big ones, the youngest to the oldest, participating in faith programs this summer. That is the sign of a very vibrant congregation. I want to thank Bekah for her hard work to make these programs a success. I want to thank the parents for trusting us with your kids. I want to thank all the Sunday School teachers and Confirmation mentors and Youth Gathering adult leaders and all the volunteers who make all these programs possible. Our youth ministry is STRONG.

SUMMER SURGE BUDGET BOOSTER FUNDRAISER

There's good news, and there's bad news. Let's start with the bad news: We're a bit behind in income verses expense. The good news is that it won't take much to get caught up. So rather than leave all the catching up to the end of the year, this year we're launching a special "Summer Surge" fundraiser. How will it work?

Part 1: During July, we're asking each family unit to give an extra dollar a day, plus one dollar. That's \$32 total for each of you. We think we can raise about \$6,000 EXTRA with just a dollar a day (plus one!). Just return the enclosed envelope with your Summer Surge gift of \$32 anytime during July. (And of course, you can give more if you'd like.)

Part 2: We're asking 20 families to match the \$6,000 in increments of \$100 (10 of you), \$250 (4 of you), \$500 (4 of you) and \$1000 (2 of you). Look for a special Summer Surge Matching envelope in the back of the church with the amount you'd like to match. That's an additional \$6,000, for a total of \$12,000.

And just to get us started, I (Pastor Elizabeth) will take a \$500 matching envelope off the table. So now we only need 19 matches!

Trinity Lutheran Church has always risen to the occasion, and we have many vibrant ministries – including 101 youth in summer faith programs! – to show for it.

Thank you for your support of Trinity and our missions. And God bless you!

GIFTS & MEMORIALS COMMITTEE

The duties of this committee include reviewing Trinity's current Gifts and Memorials policy, making appropriate updates and changes, and then submitting this revised policy to the Congregation Council for approval. The committee will also begin making a list of appropriate gifts with a general idea of the cost. This list will be given to people who want to make a donation to a specific project at Trinity.

Initially, one member will serve for three years, one for two years, and one for one year. Thereafter, each member on this committee will serve a three-year term.

The committee will meet at the convenience of the members and as needed. The committee will also be in charge of updating the Gifts and Memorials Book.

- An Alternative Giving Fair between Thanksgiving and Christmas, organized by the Mission Team.
- A Noisy/Crinkly Offering organized by the Mission Team to raise funds and awareness of the needs of people in Puerto Rico and South Sudan.
- To host the Root River Conference joint Reformation Service on October 28, 2018.

VISIONING & PLANNING TEAM

In June 2017, several members of the congregation met with a building consultant provided to us by the Mission Investment Fund of the ELCA. The consultant, Anne Gerrietts, made recommendations about our building concerns. We are now ready to move to the next step and are looking for people to serve on the Visioning & Planning Team.

According to Anne and the MIF, "There are people in your congregation that are visionaries and can develop a plan for future growth and enhancement of the congregation. This team will consider the congregation's sacred history and what new ministries and programs you feel God is calling you to do for the members and families of the congregation, your community and throughout the world."

The Visioning & Planning Team will make recommendations to the Congregation Council for changes to our Church Facility and for the staff to enhance, strengthen and expand current ministries and new ministries and programs for the future.

The responsibilities of this group will include:

- 1. Reviewing challenges in current ministries, programs and activities.
- 2. Discussing growth of current ministries and the addition of new ministries for the next three to five years.
- 3. Surveying church committees, program supervisors, and activity coordinators for space need ideas and improvements.
- 4. Reviewing the church use by community groups and organizations.
- 5. Discussing building space for multi-purpose use and scheduling of programs and events.
- 6. Reviewing outdoor opportunities for sports fields, picnic areas, playground space, and parking.
- 7. Developing building space needs based on type of activity, program, and size of group.
- 8. Reviewing all storage needs for each group and activity
- 9. Prioritizing the building space needs from your research and information gathering.
- 10. Listing short-term issues that can be addressed to enhance the current church facility for great curb appeal and a welcoming first impression.
- 11. Making a presentation of the Team's recommendations for space needs and use to the Congregation Council.


