

And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people." Matthew 4:19, Mark 1:17 ...

Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." Luke 5:10b ...

The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." John 1:43

Dear friends in Christ.

The gospel writers – Matthew, Mark, Luke and John – each record particular aspects of Jesus' life and ministry. Some of the stories and parables appear in much the same form in one or more of the gospels. But only the calling of the disciples appears in each of the four gospels.

And each of the stories begins with similar words: "Follow me." "Don't be afraid."



The disciples could have had no idea what their lives and commitments would be like when they first dropped their nets to follow Jesus. We read the gospels and it seems like they must have been stronger than us, or more gifted than us, or braver than us. How many of us would leave our jobs and families and homes to follow someone, after all? How many of us are likely to face martyrdom because of our faith?

But stories about the original disciples are not meant to intimidate us or scare us. They are not meant to make us feel inadequate. And they are even only partially meant to inspire us. The original disciples who followed Jesus were and are examples for us. But the term "disciple" really just means "one who engages in learning through instruction from another." Discipline is "to study, learn, train, and apply a system of standards." So we disciples of Jesus are called to learn – from Scripture and from other disciples – what Jesus is calling us to do in the world.

This year during our Wednesday evening Lenten services we will follow the Holden Evening Prayer service and study what it means to become a disciple based on five key texts:

Called. Luke 9:23-27: What does it mean to take up our cross daily and follow Jesus?

Equipped. Luke 22:24-27: What does it mean to be a servant of Christ?

Sent. Luke 10:1-6: What does it really mean to be a lamb amongst the wolves?

Supported. John 14:18,25-27: How can we learn to rely on the Holy Spirit?

Prepared. Matthew 28:18-20: How can we remind ourselves that Jesus is with us always?

We are all modern-day disciples of Christ. Our mission looks different depending on the gifts we've been given through the Holy Spirit. But we share a baptism and a fellowship and a leader. We are called to follow Jesus. Don't be afraid!

MINNESOTA FOOD SHARE MARCH CAMPAIGN: MARCH 1-APRIL 20

Some people face food insecurity every day, while others struggle after an unexpected expense or decrease in income. Hunger can lead to poor health or illness in addition to poor performance at school or work.

The annual Minnesota Food Share March campaign promotes the collection of food and funds to stock food shelves across the state. As an official participant, Semcac's Houston County Food Shelf will receive a percentage of the undesignated statewide March Food Share funds. The allocation depends on the amount of food and money raised during March and on the number of people served during the remainder of the year.

The Care Team at Trinity encourages donations of food and money to help with this campaign. Donations must be received by April 12 to count toward the March Food Share campaign.

Respond to food insecurity in our community by filling a grocery bag with much needed food and household items for our local Food Shelf. Trinity also has a Little Free Pantry (not to be confused with Houston County Food Shelf in Caledonia) that is located at the bottom of the stairs of the south entrance (closest to the parking lot). This Little Free Pantry is available for <u>anyone</u> to use.

Often needed items: proteins (canned meat, fish, and beans; nuts, nut butters), dried herbs and spices, gluten-free flours and flour blends (ex. Coconut, oat, rice, almond, tapioca, chickpea, sorghum, cassava, amaranth, buckwheat, teff), personal care items (shampoo, soap, deodorant, toothpaste, feminine hygiene, diapers, toilet paper), household supplies (laundry detergent, dish detergent, kitchen and bathroom cleaners, paper towels).

Jennifer and her husband, Fred, and 12-year-old daughter live in Spring Grove and are active members of Trinity. Jennifer was diagnosed with Inflammatory breast cancer March 2015. She underwent chemotherapy, surgery and radiation. Her cancer went into remission and she enjoyed continuing to teach Special Education and work towards her master's degree in the Special Education field. After many months of headaches, it was discovered in February 2018, that the cancer had metastasized

to her brain, preventing her from being able to complete her master's degree. Jennifer underwent brain surgery resulting in a semi-paralysis of her right side and speech difficulty, along with chemo and radiation once again. In November 2019 she was once again told her cancer had returned and had invaded her bones. Surgery has been done to stabilize her right leg, while chemo and radiation have begun to tackle the cancer in the affected bones.

The Gustavus Wind Orchestra, founded in 1878, is the premiere and official touring wind ensemble of the Department of Music at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, MN. Gustavus Wind Orchestra (GWO) holds the distinguished honor of being the oldest touring collegiate band in the United States west of the Mississippi River.

The Gustavus Wind Orchestra has toured annually within the United States and Canada, traveling internationally every four years. These tours bring GWO's music and service model to all corners of the globe and have reached thousands of communities and hundreds of thousands of people world-wide. Their esteemed touring tradition began in 1881.

The 65 members of the GWO, represent almost all academic majors on campus. Founded in 1862, Gustavus Adolphus College is a highly selective, private, coeducational, residential liberal arts college affiliated with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).

LUTHERAN CAMPUS CENTER UPDATE: OUR STUDENTS IMPRESS ME ALL THE TIME

When they looked at their calendars and noticed they didn't have classes on Tuesday, they decided to spend the afternoon outside, hiking on the trails behind Holzinger Lodge. That morning, we awoke to a fresh blanket of snow in Winona, the kind that leaves a frosty line upon each and every branch in the trees. As we hiked, we had to stop (not just for physical breaks.) but because the beauty of God's creation around us was breathtaking. We broke the trail ourselves at times, which meant extra work for our boots, but also an extra layer of silencethat special kind that comes when the world is muted by snow. The students embraced the guiet respite from screens, schedules, and stress. Sometimes we talked; sometimes we simply walked together in the woods.

Well, you and I both know we weren't just walking in the woods; we were praying. Praying with our boots, breath, each remark on the beauty all around, and in our being together in the present moment.

This seemingly simple hour is one I hope our students will carry with them beyond Tuesday. I hope they carry an appreciation for God's creation, for silence and breaks, relationships, and embodied prayer. And, when I stop and think about it, that is pretty radical considering how often we're told to keep going, producing, posting, and proving ourselves; how often we're surrounded by noise and distraction.

I am thankful for a hike in the snow-covered bluffs, and I am thankful for each and every one of you who supports such a moment for our dear students. May you, too, find a moment for appreciating the simple profound gift of today.

FEBRUARY 12, 2020 CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS Motions approved:

- To appoint Milly Halverson as Congregation Council Vice President.
- To move the Rosendahl fund from the Heritage Endowment umbrella into a separate fund in a Thrivent account. The Rosendahl bequest is dedicated for a ground floor addition to the existing church building.
- To hire Gary Wilhelmson to fill the custodial position at Trinity. This position will consist of maintenance and cleaning. Trinity will pay Gary to obtain a boiler license.

Updates

- Current office computers are out-of-date and their capacity is not adequate for updated software needs. Judy Tollefsrud is working with Ryan at Spring Grove Communications to develop a plan to determine replacement computers. Ryan will be attending the Finance Team meeting in March with recommendations.
- Pastor Elizabeth gave an update on the meeting with Jeff Wieser and his architect, Greg Cashman. Feedback forms were filled out by special committee and presented to the architect. Results from the architect are expected to be present on or before the second week of March.
- Spring Grove Chamber of Commerce invited Trinity council members to their visioning meeting on February 19. Lara Wold Mendez and Dean Wiste will attend the meeting.
- Pastor Elizabeth would like to schedule an All Team Retreat this summer where each team would focus
 on where they would like to spend their time and attention regarding our Lutheran identity. More details

St. Patrick's Day – the rest of the story...

Though he is the patron saint of Ireland, Patrick was actually born in what is now Wales in the year 389. At age sixteen, Patrick was kidnapped by Irish pirates and sold into slavery in Ireland. He escaped after six years, returned to his family in southwest Britain, and began to prepare for ordained ministry. He later returned to Ireland, this time to serve as a bishop and missionary to the people that once held him as a slave. Patrick bravely and freely spread Christianity all through the land where he was once held captive. He died on March 17, 461. His famous baptismal hymn is still sung today, "I Bind unto Myself Today."
